AN ACT

FURTHER AMENDING REPUBLIC ACT 9994, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE "EXPANDED SENIOR CITIZENS ACT"

Be it enacted by the Senate and the House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

SECTION 1. Section 4 of Republic Act No. 7432, as amended by Republic Act No. 9994, otherwise known as the Expanded Senior Citizen Act of 2010, is hereby amended further to read as follows:

"Section 4. Privileges for the Senior Citizens

"x x x

"(m) Exempted from the payment of Driver's License Fee"

"x x x."

SECTION 2. Repealing Clause – Relevant sections Act No. 7432, as amended by Republic Act No. 9994, otherwise known as the Expanded Senior Citizens Act of 2010; and all laws, presidential decrees, executive orders, rules and regulations, and parts thereof which are inconsistent with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed or modified accordingly.

SECTION3. Separability Clause -If, for any reason, any section or provision of this Act, or any portion thereof, of the application of such section, provision, or portion to any person, group, or circumstance is declared invalid or unconstitutional, the remainder of this Act or the application of such section, provision, or portion thereof to other persons, groups, or circumstances shall not be affected by such declaration.

SECTION 4. *Effectivity* – This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days following its publication in three (3) newspapers of general circulation.
