
EXPLANATORY NOTE

AN ACT

**MANDATING THE INCLUSION OF AN ANTI-ILLEGAL DRUGS SUBJECT IN THE
K+12 PROGRAM, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.**

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in
Congress assembled:

Section 1. The Department of Education shall include in the curriculum of the K+12 program in all public and private schools the teaching of anti-illegal drugs as part of the health subject.

Section 2. Classroom discussions shall include the different regulated and prohibited drugs and its harmful effects.

Section 3. All laws, acts, decrees, orders, and regulations, issuances or parts thereof which are inconsistent with any of the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed, amended or modified accordingly.

Section 4. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its complete publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.

Approved.
