Thereupon, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.P.), there being no objection, the Body resumed consideration on Second Reading of House

Bill No. 8165 contained in Committee Report No. 842 as reported out by the Committees on Government Reorganization, National Defense and Security, and Appropriations.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT CREATING THE DEPARTMENT OF DISASTER RESILIENCE, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.”

Representative Gonzales (A.P.) stated that the parliamentary status was that the Bill was in the period of sponsorship and debate; and on her motion, the Chair recognized Rep. Yedda Marie K. Romualdez for her sponsorship speech.

SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ROMUALDEZ

At the outset, Representative Romualdez recalled the disaster brought by typhoon “Haiyan” to her district and the ensuing suffering of its victims that was caused by bureaucratic paralysis and poor coordination by different government agencies. In this regard, she spoke on the creation of the Department of Disaster Resilience (DDR) which will be primarily responsible for leading, managing and organizing the national effort to reduce disaster risk, effectively reduce the country’s vulnerability to natural hazards, consolidate and support local disaster risk reduction, and streamline government disaster resilience programs and projects, among others.

In conclusion, she stated that with the creation of the DDR, the government would be ready and better equipped to address the risks of natural disasters and the threats of climate change, empower local government units to rise above the different vulnerabilities that surround them, and ensure that such tragedy would never happen again.

ADOPTION OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 20

On motion of Rep. Victoria Isabel G. Noel, there being no objection, the Body considered House Concurrent Resolution No. 20, entitled:

“CONCURRENT RESOLUTION URGING THE COMMISSION ON ELECTIONS TO RESET TO OCTOBER 11 TO 17, 2018 FROM OCTOBER 1 TO 5, 2018 THE FILING OF THE CERTIFICATES OF CANDIDACY IN CONNECTION WITH THE MAY 13, 2019 NATIONAL AND LOCAL ELECTIONS”; dispensed with the reading of the text thereof without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; and unanimously adopted the same through *viva voce* voting.

APPROVAL ON THIRD READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 8083

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.P.), there being no objection, the Body proceeded to the approval on Third Reading of House Bill No. 8083, entitled: “AN ACT AMENDING SECTIONS 4, 5, 20, 22, 27, 28, 34, 40, 50, 73, 112, 117, 204, 222, 237, 237-A, 255, 256, 257, 258, 260, 261, 262, 263, 264, 265, 266, 275, 288, 290 AND ADDING SECTIONS 6-A, 282-A, 291, 292, 293, 294, 295, 296, 297, 298, 299, 300, 301, 301-A, 301-B, 302, 303, 304, 305, 306, 307, 308, 309, 310, 311, 312, 313, AND 314 UNDER THE NATIONAL INTERNAL REVENUE CODE OF 1997, AS AMENDED, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES,” printed copies of which were distributed to the Members on September 6, 2018, pursuant to Section 58, Rule X of the amended Provisional Rules of the House.

The Chair then directed the Secretary General to call the Roll for nominal voting. Thereafter, pursuant to the amended Provisional Rules of the House, a second Roll Call was made.

MANIFESTATIONS OF SEVERAL MEMBERS

During the voting, Reps. Arlene D. Brosas, Ariel “Ka Ayik” B. Casilao, Sarah Jane I. Elago, Tom S. Villarin, Carlos Isagani T. Zarate, and France L. Castro reserved their right to explain their negative votes at the appropriate time while Rep. Edcel C. Lagman reserved his right to submit a written explanation of his negative vote.

RESULT OF THE VOTING

With 187 [188] affirmative votes, 14 [15] negative votes, and three abstentions, the Body approved on Third Reading House Bill No. 8083. (See Annex) *

EXPLANATION OF VOTES

Upon recognition by the Chair, the following Members explained their votes:

* See Journal No. 19 dated September 12, 2018 for correction/ amendment on this portion.

1. Rep. Gabriel H. Bordado Jr. expressed his wish that TRAIN 2 would live up to its acronym "TRABAHO" inasmuch as economic experts have been warning Congress and the government about massive business shutdowns and large-scale obliteration of job opportunities as a direct consequence of the proposed law; this, as the people are still reeling from the devastating effects caused by TRAIN 1. Hence, he cast his negative vote on House Bill No. 8083.
2. Rep. Arlene D. Brosas said that Gabriela Women's Party votes "No" on House Bill No. 8083 as it is a pro-rich sequel of TRAIN 1 and a highly regressive measure that is anti-poor and will benefit disproportionately the big foreign and local corporations with the reduction of their corporate income taxes, as well as grant power to the President to give additional incentives to corporations.
3. Rep. Ariel "Ka Ayik" B. Casilao voted "No" on the TRABAHO (Tax Reform for Attracting Better and High Quality Opportunities) Bill because during the interpellation, the Sponsor had not given an exact number of jobs the measure could create and it is the corporations of the country's 16 richest oligarch families in the business which will stand to benefit more on tax cuts in corporate income rather than the small-medium enterprises.
4. Rep. France L. Castro said that the ACT Teachers Party-List votes "No" on the TRABAHO Bill because it is anti-local business and industry, anti-MSME, anti-poor, anti-education and health; and would serve only the big and foreign companies which will be given billions of incentives on taxes and customs duties in the name of competitiveness and foreign direct investments but none for MSMEs and other local industries.
5. Rep. Sarah Jane I. Elago voted "No" on the measure because of the following reasons: the current chronic crisis was aggravated by TRAIN 1 despite the promise of more business, more jobs and more opportunities, and a steady inflation rate; foreign and local corporations are already earning billions in profits at the expense of workers' and peoples' rights and welfare, with TRAIN 2 to give them more; and the youth will be imposed with tuition and other school fee increases by education institutions when the tax hike is implemented.
6. In voting against the measure, Rep. Tom S. Villarín stated that the Bill had no exhaustive deliberations and clearcut reliable figures to back it up. He said that with the macroeconomic fundamentals going haywire and a government in a state of denial that high inflation is no cause for worry as it is a result of economic growth, the TRABAHO Bill only provides an illusion of full employment and massive investments.
7. Speaking in Filipino, Rep. Carlos Isagani T. Zarate explained his negative vote by saying that there should not be a sequel to the anti-poor, pro-rich tax reform program of TRAIN 1. He said that the instant Bill only adds up to the burden of the marginalized sector as it lowers the taxes of big corporations and of the rich. He stated that it has been proven that investments are not the solution to the country's poverty problems and thus asked his colleagues not to give false hopes to the people that these tax systems will alleviate their condition.
8. Informing the Body that he previously reserved his right to submit a written explanation of his negative vote but decided to articulate his explanation later, Rep. Edcel C. Lagman cited the following reasons for the same: the TRABAHO Bill is a deadly sequel to the disastrous TRAIN 1 for the disadvantaged and marginalized sectors of the society; no estimates were given by the sponsoring committee or by the Department of Finance on the projection on job generation if the Bill is passed into law; no assurance was also given that corporate income tax evasion will be discouraged if the Bill becomes a law; and no projection was made on how domestic and foreign businesses will relocate with the removal of tax incentives which were granted to attract foreign investors and make the country competitive in the investors' market.

3. House Bill No. 684 and Senate Bill No. 1235, amending Republic Act No. 53, as amended, exempting the publisher, editor or reporter of any publication from revealing the source of published news or information obtained in confidence: Rep. Ben P. Evardone vice Representative Herrera-Dy.

CONCURRENCE WITH SENATE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILLS

With the consent of the Committee on Local Government as well as the authors of the measure, on successive motions of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body concurred with the Senate amendments to the following House Bills:

1. House Bill No. 7778, entitled: “AN ACT REAPPORTIONING THE PROVINCE OF ISABELA INTO SIX (6) LEGISLATIVE DISTRICTS”; and
2. House Bill No. 1926, entitled: “AN ACT CREATING A BARANGAY TO BE KNOWN AS BARANGAY POBLACION 2 IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF VILLANUEVA, PROVINCE OF MISAMIS ORIENTAL.”

PRIVILEGE HOUR

The day being a Monday, on motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection,

the Chair declared a Privilege Hour and thereafter recognized Rep. Gary C. Alejano for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ALEJANO

Representative Alejano spoke on the issuance by President Rodrigo Roa Duterte of Proclamation No. 572 which revokes the amnesty granted to Senator Antonio Trillanes IV which he said, was a clear case of political persecution against the Senator that empties baseless accusations against him.

To counter the validity of the alleged non-appearance in filing for amnesty application and non-admission of guilt of Senator Trillanes which were used as the basis for revoking his amnesty, Representative Alejano explained how the former has rightfully followed the proper procedure in amnesty applications and presented several newspaper and video clippings to prove the same.

As he criticized the Department of National Defense (DND), Armed Forces of the Philippines, and the Office of the Solicitor General for their incompetence and inefficiency, Representative Alejano also pointed out that the President's decision to revoke Senator Trillanes' amnesty has a far-reaching effect to peace and stability as he emphasized the importance of amnesty to foster unity, start anew, and have a clean slate in governance.

Adverting to Proclamation No. 75, Representative Alejano further discussed the roles played by the President, DND Secretary, and DND Adhoc Amnesty Committee in the processing and approval of amnesty applications.

He thereafter related the status of cases of military personnel who participated in the so-called Oakwood Mutiny, and how they and other rebel groups and insurgents were granted amnesty which cleared them of all legal liabilities.

After asking how rebel groups and individual persons could trust a government that can easily revoke commitments made in the past merely due to personal reasons, he stressed that the government should instead solve the vital issues of food security, inflation, corruption, and drugs instead of targeting the Opposition. He decried the President's use of government resources to get back at his enemies and warned that his unilateral revocation of Senator Trillanes' amnesty means that the country is in a dictatorship and the Members and even ordinary citizens can be similarly victimized.

REFERRAL OF REPRESENTATIVE ALEJANO'S SPEECH

On motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Alejano's speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

SUSPENSION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

Chavez, vice Minority Leader Suarez, to the Bicameral Conference Committee on the disagreeing votes on House Bill No. 7449, entitled: "AN ACT APPROPRIATING THE SUM OF ONE BILLION ONE HUNDRED SIXTY-ONE MILLION SEVEN HUNDRED TEN THOUSAND PESOS (₱1,161,710,000.00) AS SUPPLEMENTAL APPROPRIATIONS FOR FY 2018 AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES."

THE PRIVILEGE HOUR (Continuation)

With the continuation of the Privilege Hour, the Chair recognized Representative Elago for her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ELAGO

Representative Elago decried the cuts in the proposed 2019 budget of state universities and colleges (SUCs) particularly in Maintenance and Other Operating Expenses (MOOE) and Capital Outlay (CA). She likewise criticized the money-making schemes of SUCs which charge higher tuition fees and impose other school fees so as to reach their internal income targets. She stressed that the same will result in education that is unaffordable and inaccessible, thus undermining the schooling of the youth in particular and the future of the country in general.

As she then asked for support for reforms in public education, she also thanked her colleagues for supporting the call for the return of all budget cuts in the funds of all education agencies concerned and for the substantial increase in the same.

REFERRAL OF REPRESENTATIVE ELAGO'S SPEECH

On motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Elago's speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

On motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), the Chair recognized Rep. Ariel "Ka Ayik" B. Casilao to deliver his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CASILAO

Speaking in Filipino, Representative Casilao focused on the present rice and food crisis which he said is a big blow to the farmers and contractual workers, and noted that the National Food Authority's (NFA's) solution to the problem has resulted in the poor quality but higher cost of rice. He said that the government's pronouncement of a 6.4% inflation rate is conservative, because prices of said basic commodities have increased by 10% to 20% primarily due to the implementation of the Tax Reform for Acceleration and Inclusion Law. He cautioned against the NFA's Philippine Development Plan 2017-2022 that would enable private traders to monopolize the rice industry.

Representative Casilao appealed on behalf of the marginalized sector for the immediate and urgent solution to the following concerns: price control on rice; strengthening of the role of the NFA; provision of free irrigation; abolition of Fisheries Code; and implementation of a genuine agrarian reform program. He reminded the Body that in order to defend Philippine agriculture and the rice industry, liberalization of agriculture should be stopped and the government should pull out from the World Trade Organization Agreement on Agriculture.

REFERRAL OF REPRESENTATIVE CASILAO'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Casilao's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), the Chair recognized Representative Brosas for her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BROSAS

At the outset, Representative Brosas announced that the Philippines was once again number one in

soaring inflation rates among Asian countries. She said that inflation can be felt not only in Metro Manila but also in the Lumad communities.

She then informed the Body that various sectors recently conducted two solidarity and fact-finding missions with Lumads in Mindanao and recorded the following issues: red-tagging, landlessness and limited access to agricultural resources and livelihood due to intense militarization, land grabbing of ancestral domain by private firms, large-scale mining projects, reforestation problems, and increase in the prices of commodities due to the implementation of the TRAIN Law.

As she reiterated that the Philippines was once again in the limelight in Asia, Representative Brosas then emphasized that it is in first place as regards the issue of poverty and the policy of the government is killing not only the economy but also the people.

REFERRAL OF REPRESENTATIVE BROSAS' PRIVILEGE SPEECH
