DUTERTE TO INVITE REGIONAL AND NATIONAL STAKEHOLDERS TO A CONSULTATIVE ASSEMBLY IN PREPARATION FOR THE COMMEMORATION OF THE QUINCENTENNIAL ARRIVAL OF FERDINAND MAGELLAN IN THE PHILIPPINES”;
 6. House Resolution No. 1688 contained in Committee Report No. 612 as submitted by the Committee on Cooperatives Development, entitled: “RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE ACES CREDIT DEVELOPMENT INCORPORATED MULTIPURPOSE COOPERATIVE (ACDIMPC) FOR ITS OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS AND LEADERSHIP IN THE UPLIFTMENT AND DEVELOPMENT OF ITS MEMBERS IN THE COUNTRY-SIDE”;
 7. House Resolution No. 1700 contained in Committee Report No. 616 as submitted by the Committee on Cooperatives Development, entitled: “RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE VICTO NATIONAL FEDERATION FOR ITS OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENTS AND VALUABLE CONTRIBUTIONS IN UPLIFTING COMMUNITIES BY PROMOTING SELF-RELIANCE AND COOPERATIVISM”; and
 8. House Resolution No. 1703 contained in Committee Report No. 618 as submitted by the Committee on Cooperatives Development, entitled: “RESOLUTION COMMENDING THE SAN DIONISIO CREDIT COOPERATIVE (SDCC) FOR ITS PIONEERING COOPERATIVISM IN THE COUNTRY AND FOR ITS OUTSTANDING LEADERSHIP AND ACHIEVEMENTS IN THE ECONOMIC UPLIFTMENT OF ITS MEMBERS AND ITS CONTRIBUTIONS TO NATIONAL DEVELOPMENT.”
- Likewise, on successive motions of Representative Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body considered House Resolution No. 2152, entitled: “A RESOLUTION HONORING AND COMMENDING THE METROBANK FOUNDATION OUTSTANDING FILIPINOS OF 2018”; dispensed with the reading of the text of the

measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; and unanimously adopted the same in consolidation with House Resolutions No. 2079, 2095, 2097, and 2166.

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF MEASURES UNDER THE BUSINESS FOR THE DAY

On successive motions of Rep. Vini Nola A. Ortega, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading the following House Bills calendared under the Business for the Day, contained in Committee Reports as submitted by the Committee on Legislative Franchises; dispensed with the reading of the texts of the measures without prejudice to their insertion into the Record of the House; adopted the Explanatory Notes of the Bills as the sponsorship remarks on the measures upon motion of Rep. Franz E. Alvarez, Chairperson of the sponsoring Committee; terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; terminated the period of amendments in the absence of Committee and individual amendments; and approved the same on Second Reading through *viva voce* voting:

1. House Bill No. 8176 contained in Committee Report No. 846, renewing for another twenty-five (25) years the franchise granted to Radioworld Broadcasting Corporation under Republic Act (R.A.) No. 8219;
2. House Bill No. 8177 contained in Committee Report No. 847, renewing for another twenty-five (25) years the franchise granted to Rajah Broadcasting Network, Inc. to construct, install, establish, operate and maintain radio and television broadcasting stations in the Philippines under R.A. No. 4505, as amended by R.A. No. 8104; and
3. House Bill No. 8175 contained in Committee Report No. 845, renewing for another twenty-five (25) years the franchise granted to Southern Broadcasting Network, Inc. under R.A. No. 8147.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The session was suspended at 3:44 p.m. upon motion of Representative Ortega (V.N.).

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 3:54 p.m.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Thereupon, Rep. Marlyn B. Alonte acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Deputy Speaker Raneo “Ranie” E. Abu.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS: COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 842 ON HOUSE BILL NO. 8165

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Alonte, there being no objection, the Body resumed the consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 8165 contained in Committee Report No. 842 as reported out by the Committees on Government Reorganization, National Defense and Security, and Appropriations.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT CREATING THE DEPARTMENT OF DISASTER RESILIENCE, DEFINING ITS POWERS AND FUNCTIONS, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR.”

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Alonte, the Chair recognized Rep. Joey Sarte Salceda, one of the main authors of the Bill, to sponsor the measure and Rep. Frederick W. Siao for his manifestation.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE SIAO

As he had witnessed firsthand the horrors and devastations brought by Tropical Storm “Sendong” in his hometown of Iligan City, Representative Siao praised the Project Nationwide Operational Assessment of Hazards (NOAH) for empowering communities by way of providing access to reliable and timely information. He then recommended that the national government strongly support Project NOAH as well as the latter’s incorporation into the proposed Department of Disaster Resilience (DDR) in the same way that the Philippine Atmospheric, Geophysical and Astronomical Services Administration (PAGASA) and the Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology (PHIVOLCS) will become attached agencies of the DDR.

Representative Siao subsequently suggested that Project NOAH’s headquarters remain at the University of the Philippines so as to retain its focus on facts and sciences and to partly insulate itself from organizational politics that characterizes a Cabinet-level department, but to receive regular funding under the proposed Department.

On motion of Representative Alonte, the Chair recognized Rep. Tom S. Villarín for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN

Representatives Villarín and Salceda exchanged views on how the instant Bill differed from the existing disaster policy framework of the government in terms of disaster preparedness, coordination with other stakeholders, calamity funds usage and accountability, disaster and climate proofing, and recovery and rehabilitation of disaster-affected localities.

Representatives Villarín and Salceda subsequently discussed some advantages of creating the proposed DDR, to wit: it will integrate all responses to disasters and calamities into one single office; and it will have allocations in the General Appropriations Act (GAA) to augment the calamity funds and Capital Outlay (CO) funds of local government units (LGUs) especially in third- and fourth-class municipalities. Such CO funds, they agreed, could cover the purchase of vehicles, heavy equipment, and storage facilities for relief goods as well as the implementation of drainage, slope protection, and related projects.

They also analyzed the DDR's jurisdiction over the Department of Science and Technology (DOST), PAGASA, and PHIVOLCS; and over the suspension of classes and evacuation of citizens during calamities.

Representatives Villarín and Salceda discussed the role and power of the DDR to respond to disasters; how it would enforce the noncompliance or lack of implementation of environmental laws and policies; its role and function to audit and monitor the use of disaster calamity fund and the Quick Response Fund of the different LGUs; and whether the establishment of a DDR would solve the slow disbursement of disaster funds.

As he congratulated Representative Salceda for putting up a permanent Disaster Management Office in Albay, the first of such kind by any LGU in the entire Asia, Representative Villarín likewise congratulated the latter for incorporating it into the proposed measure.

REMINDER FROM THE CHAIR

At this juncture, the Chair reminded Representative Villarín that he had already consumed his one-hour allotted time to which he replied that he would wrap up with his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN

(Continuation)

After pointing out the possible implication of an increased budget for personnel services under the GAA with the creation of the DDR, Representative Villarín expressed hope that his reservations on the Bill would disappear once the proper amendments are made and accepted at the proper time.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Alonte, the Chair recognized Rep. Carlos Isagani T. Zarate for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ZARATE

To Representative Zarate's initial query, Representative Salceda pointed out that the proposed Department of Disaster Resilience would take charge in case a disaster hits the country and thus, would be given its own funding. At present, the latter explained that there is only the Office of Civil Defense which acts as the Secretariat of the National Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council and coordinates with different government agencies for fund sourcing in times of disasters.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Abueg relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Raneó "Ranie" E. Abu.

Representative Zarate inquired why they still have to create another layer in the bureaucracy when there is already the huge Department of the Interior and Local Government.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Abu relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Abueg.

The Members then discussed 1) the need to have one agency that would make policies, projects, and programs to address the effects of climate change; 2) the effect on the functions of the different agencies that would be tapped to be incorporated in the DDR; and 3) the projected budget for the DDR.

Subsequently, Representative Zarate's interpellation revolved around various issues such as the proper management of disaster funds, potential job displacements due to the integration of existing offices, and the fate of job-orders, contractual and contract of service employees. The Sponsor committed to give his colleagues a list of the affected government employees.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE CASTRO (F.L.)

Recognized by the Chair on motion of Representative Alonte, Rep. France L. Castro's interpellation focused on the ability of the proposed Department to respond faster to natural or man-made disasters; the definition of "disaster" according to the United Nations; and the issue of development aggression that the proposed DDR would address in coordination with other concerned agencies like the Department of Environment and Natural Resources.

They also delved into how the DDR would handle disasters and post-disaster operations through its implementation of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan, Local Climate Change Adaptation Plan, and Local Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Plan; the partnership role of the education sector in disaster risk reduction and climate change mitigation, through the integration of the topic in school curricula and textbooks; how the proposed law would affect other existing laws like the Local Government Code and the National Building Code, among others; how the creation of the DDR would affect the budgets, organizational integrity, and functions of the PHIVOLCS, and the PAGASA; and the mechanisms and goals of the Research and Development Plan in preventing the occurrence of disasters and calamities.

Finally, the Members also focused on the role of the private sector and the indigenous ways in coping with calamities and saving lives, as well as the "calling out powers" of the DDR secretary in times of imminent and actual disasters.

SUSPENSION OF CONSIDERATION ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 8165

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body suspended the consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 8165.

On motion of Representative Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 8143 contained in Committee Report No. 832 as reported out by the Committees on Tourism, and Appropriations.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

"AN ACT MANDATING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS AND HIGHWAYS TO PRIORITIZE THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE NECESSARY INFRASTRUCTURE TO ENSURE THE ACCESSIBILITY OF ALL TOURISM SITES IN THE COUNTRY, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR."

As copies of the Bill had been distributed to the Members, on motion of Representative Primicias-Agabas, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House.

Upon Representative Primicias-Agabas' motion, the session was suspended at 6:14 p.m.
