**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:
COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 848
ON HOUSE BILL NO. 8179**

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Hofer, there being no objection, the Body resumed the consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 8179 contained in Committee Report No. 848 as reported out by the Committee on Legislative Franchises.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT GRANTING SOLAR PARA SA BAYAN CORPORATION A FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT, INSTALL, ESTABLISH, OPERATE AND MAINTAIN DISTRIBUTABLE POWER TECHNOLOGIES AND MINIGRID SYSTEMS THROUGHOUT THE PHILIPPINES TO IMPROVE ACCESS TO SUSTAINABLE ENERGY.”

Representative Hofer stated that the parliamentary status of the measure was that the period of amendments was terminated and on her motion, the Chair recognized Deputy Speaker Arthur C. Yap, one of the main authors, to sponsor the said measure.

QUERY OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Upon recognition by the Chair, Rep. Jose L. Atienza Jr. inquired whether the Members would be given clean copies of the final version of House Bill No. 8179 before its approval on Second Reading.

With the permission of the Chair, Deputy Speaker Yap replied that clean copies of the measure would be distributed that day.

Thereupon, Representative Atienza requested that the Body suspend in the meantime its session until the Members have been given clean copies of House Bill No. 8179.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The session was suspended at 3:26 p.m. upon motion of Representative Hofer.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 3:27 p.m.

**REMARKS OF
REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA**

With regard to the query of Representative Atienza, the Senior Deputy Majority Leader, Rep. Rodante D. Marcoleta clarified that final copies of House Bill No. 8179 are not yet ready considering that the measure is yet to be approved on Second Reading. He added that final copies of a measure can only be distributed to the Members before its approval on Third Reading.

The Chair then took note of the remark of Representative Marcoleta.

**REMARKS OF
REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

As he respected the opinion of the Senior Deputy Majority Leader, Representative Atienza stressed that the Members should be given copies of the measure given its contentious features.

**REMARKS OF
REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA**

Representative Marcoleta stated that his remarks are based on the amended Provisional Rules of the House that clean copies of a particular measure can only be distributed before its approval on Third Reading and reiterated that the final version of House Bill No. 8179 is not yet available considering that it is yet to be approved on Second Reading.

**REMARKS OF
REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Representative Atienza stated however that House Bill No. 8179 cannot be approved on Second Reading because the amendments are not clear and

reiterated that said measure is one of the most contentious franchise bills that Congress has deliberated on.

MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

Thereupon, Representative Marcoleta requested for a ruling of the Chair with regard to his statement that clean copies of the measure cannot be distributed to the Members considering that it is yet to be approved on Second Reading.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza appealed to Representative Marcoleta to be more magnanimous on the matter as they have never been separated by an issue.

RULING OF THE CHAIR

The Chair then ruled in favor of the remarks of Representative Marcoleta.

MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

Representative Marcoleta moved for the recognition of Deputy Speaker Yap (A.) to sponsor the measure during the period of amendments.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza stated that he would no longer insist on being provided a clean copy of the measure but he however would like to pose a question to the Sponsor of the measure.

WITHDRAWAL OF THE MOTION OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

Representative Marcoleta withdrew his previous motion considering that the period of amendments had already been terminated.

QUERY OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza inquired whether the Sponsor can still accommodate his one question.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

Upon a query from the Chair, Representative Marcoleta stated that the parliamentary status was that the Body had already terminated the period of amendments on House Bill No. 8179.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza stated that he would only ask one question to the Sponsor of the measure.

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 8179, AS AMENDED

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Marcoleta, there being no objection, the Body approved on Second Reading, through *viva voce* voting, House Bill No. 8179, as amended.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza stated that the *viva voce* voting was not clear and requested for a head count.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

Representative Marcoleta stated that the Rules provide that a Member can only ask for nominal voting if the Chair himself decides that the result of the *viva voce* voting was not clear.

RULING OF THE CHAIR

Upon query from Representative Marcoleta, the Chair ruled that those who voted *ayes* have preponderance and that House Bill No. 8179 was approved on Second Reading, as amended.

At this point, the Chair recognized Representative Atienza for his manifestation.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza stated that a prohibition should be provided for in House Bill No. 8179 as the franchise could be used as a business venture. He then inquired whether the Sponsor has incorporated the amendment providing that if the franchise is sold to anyone, especially to foreigners, said franchise is automatically deemed dissolved and non-effective.

REMINDER FROM THE CHAIR

The Chair reminded Representative Atienza that his time had already expired.

**REMARKS OF
REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Representative Atienza stated that his query was for the Sponsor of the measure and not to Representative Marcoleta.

The Chair stated that he had recognized Representative Atienza only for a manifestation.

Affirming the same, Representative Atienza stated however that he would like to know the reply of the Sponsor of the measure.

REMARKS OF THE CHAIR

As moved by Representative Marcoleta, the Chair noted the manifestation of Representative Atienza as part of the discussion on House Bill No. 8179.

**REMARKS OF
REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA**

Representative Atienza stated that he would take the answer of the Sponsor as a “No” as the latter refused to answer his query. He then submitted that the franchise that would be granted was onerous, abnormal, and questionable.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:
COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 923 ON
RESOLUTION OF BOTH HOUSES NO. 15**

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Marcoleta, there being no objection, the Body resumed the consideration on Second Reading of Resolution of Both Houses (R.B.H.) No. 15 contained in Committee Report No. 923 as reported out by the Committee on Constitutional Amendments.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the measure, to wit:

“RESOLUTION OF BOTH HOUSES PROPOSING THE REVISION OF THE 1987 CONSTITUTION OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES.”

Representative Marcoleta stated that the parliamentary status was that the period of sponsorship and debate on Resolution of Both Houses was terminated the previous day.

PERIOD OF AMENDMENTS

On motion of Representative Marcoleta, there being no objection, the Body proceeded to the period of amendments and the Chair recognized Rep.

Wilter “Sharky” Wee Palma II, one of the authors of the measure, to sponsor the same.

COMMITTEE AMENDMENT

As proposed by Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body approved the Committee amendment on page 44, line 25, Section 4 of Article XVII, to replace the word “Senate” with VICE.

There being no other Committee amendments, on motion of Representative Marcoleta, there being no objection, the Body terminated the period of Committee amendments and thereafter proceeded to the period of individual amendments.

**AMENDMENTS OF
REPRESENTATIVE SIAO**

As successively proposed by Rep. Frederick W. Siao and accepted by the Sponsor, there being no objection, the Body approved the following amendments in:

1. Section 2, Article VIII;
2. Section 12, Article XII;
3. Section 11, Article X;
4. Section 2, Article XIII, as modified by Representative Palma;
5. All sections and pages, subject to style, as regards the removal of all gender-sensitive words;
6. Section 28, Article III.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT
OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

Recognized by the Chair, Rep. Antonio L. Tinio proposed an amendment in the resolutory clause on page 2, line 11 to insert the clause VOTING SEPARATELY.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Representative Palma, the Chair declared a recess at 3:46 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 3:48 p.m.

**APPROVAL OF PROPOSED AMENDMENT
OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

As previously proposed by Representative Tinio and accepted by the Sponsor, there being no objection, the Body approved the amendment in the resolutory clause on page 2 of R.B.H. No. 15.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio next proposed in Section 6, Article II, to delete the sentence, "Relations between them shall be governed by benevolent neutrality."

After Representative Palma did not accept the same which was seconded by Representative Marcoleta, Representative Tinio moved that the Body vote on his amendment.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair suspended the session at 3:51 p.m. upon Representative Hofer's motion.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 3:52 p.m., the session resumed.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

Upon direction of the Chair, Representative Marcoleta explained that Representative Palma did not accept the previous proposal of Representative Tinio so the latter moved for a division of the House. He clarified that an *Aye* vote would be in support of said proposed amendment while a *Nay* vote was in support of the Sponsor's non-acceptance of the same.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Before the Body proceeded with the voting, Representative Atienza requested the Secretary General to clearly state first the issues involved.

The Chair however ruled that the Body was in the process of voting which could not be interrupted.

VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REPRESENTATIVE TINIO'S AMENDMENT

Thereupon, the Chair called for a *viva voce* voting on Representative Tinio's amendment, and with majority voting against it, the same was lost.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA (Continuation)

Representative Atienza then pointed out that the voting was already finished and asked the Secretary General to clarify the issue that the Body had voted on, for the record.

After the Chair said that Representative Marcoleta had already properly addressed the question of Representative Atienza even before the *viva voce* voting, the latter asked that the Chair be more magnanimous in presiding over the session; pointed out that the Chair had kept on denying his requests; and stressed that he would not allow the Chair to continue being biased and personal.

The Chair disagreed with Representative Atienza while the latter reiterated he was just asking for a clarification.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE PALMA

Upon recognition by the Chair, Representative Palma clarified that Representative Tinio wanted to remove a sentence in Section 6, Article II but that he did not accept the proposal.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

At this point, Representative Atienza said that he will just approach the Sponsor about the matter.

REMARKS OF THE CHAIR

At this point, the Chair appealed to the Members to listen to the amendments being proposed on the floor.

AMENDMENTS OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

As subsequently proposed by Representative Tinio and accepted by the Sponsor, there being no objection, the Body approved the former's proposed amendments on Sections 10 and 22 of Article II.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio then proposed on page 5, Section 25 of Article II, to include the constitutional prohibition on political dynasties.

The Sponsor did not accept the same.

Representative Tinio thereupon explained his amendment as being in consonance with the other principles enunciated in the proposed Constitution such as the right of every person to reduce social, economic, and political inequalities by diffusing political power. In this context, he said that political power is concentrated in political dynasties, and thereafter asked that the Body vote thereon.

**VIVA VOCE VOTING ON
REPRESENTATIVE TINIO'S AMENDMENT**

Thereupon, the Chair called for a *viva voce* voting on Representative Tinio's amendment, and with majority voting against it, the same was lost.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT
OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

Representative Tinio next proposed on page 5, Section 1 of Article III, to delete the sentence, "The natural right to protect oneself shall always be respected by the State." He said that the right to due process is the first fundamental right guaranteed under the 1987 Constitution.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair declared a recess at 4:06 p.m. upon Representative Palma's motion.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 4:06 p.m., the session resumed.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT
OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO
(Continuation)**

After Representative Tinio did not accept the amendment of the Sponsor to just place the aforementioned sentence in the last part of Section 1 of Article III, the latter said he could not accept Representative Tinio's proposal.

**REMARKS OF
REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA**

At this point, Representative Marcoleta reiterated that the House was in the period of considering individual amendments and that it was up to the Sponsor to accept or reject such amendments. He stressed that interpellations or explanations about amendments were not in order.

**POINT OF ORDER
OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

Representative Tinio however said that according to the House Rules, amendments are subject to the five-minute rule.

With leave of the Chair, Representative Marcoleta reiterated that R.B.H No. 15 was in the period of amendments and said that if the Sponsor does not accept an amendment, the Member's remedy is an appeal and not an interpellation.

Representative Tinio subsequently clarified that he was not interpellating but availing of his right to explain his proposed amendment under the five-minute rule.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

At 4:10 p.m., the Chair suspended the session upon Representative Marcoleta's motion.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:18 p.m.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT
OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

Thereupon, Representative Tinio proposed on page 8, to delete the entire Article IV on "Bill of Duties"; but the Sponsor did not accept the same which was seconded by Representative Marcoleta.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio appealed for the approval of his proposal, saying it was the first time in the history of the Philippine Constitution that a Bill of Duties was added therein which would tie citizens to the duty of cooperating with the State's forces in attaining the rule of law and peace and order.

He said that the inclusion of said provision in the proposed Constitution would give license to restrict and suppress the legitimate, legal, and constitutional rights of the people to dissent which were provided for in a democracy. He surmised that this can happen during rallies when a grievance is aired against a State policy, and the proposed "Bill of Duties" can be used against the rallyists to demand cooperation and legitimize repression.

**VIVA VOCE VOTING ON
REPRESENTATIVE TINIO'S AMENDMENT**

Thereupon, the Chair called for a *viva voce* voting on the proposed amendment of Representative Tinio, and with the majority voting against it, the same was lost.

**PROPOSED AMENDMENT
OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

Representative Tinio then proposed to delete Sections 1 and 2 of Article VII, on establishing a two-party system under the proposed Constitution.

Representative Palma rejected the proposed amendment and Representative Marcoleta adopted the action taken by the Sponsor.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio stated that the Duterte Administration's main objective in drafting the proposed Federal Constitution was not the shift to federalism but rather to establish a two-party system that would concentrate political power in the dominant political party which, more often than not, is the party being represented by the incumbents. He cited the dictatorial regime under the late President Ferdinand E. Marcos wherein only one political party dominated at that time. He thus expressed his vehement opposition to the subject Article VII providing for a two-party system as this would be the key ingredient that will lead to the formation of one-party rule.

VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REPRESENTATIVE TINIO'S AMENDMENT

The Chair submitted Representative Tinio's proposed amendment to a vote, and with the *Nays* having preponderance, the same was lost.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Subsequently, Representative Tinio proposed on Section 18 of Article IX, to delete the words "lawless violence" as among the grounds upon which the President may suspend the writ of *habeas corpus* or declare martial law.

Representative Palma rejected the proposed amendment and Representative Marcoleta adopted the action taken by the Sponsor.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio explained that the inclusion of the words "lawless violence" in the proposed Constitution could put the country in a dangerous situation as this could serve as a ground for the suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* or the declaration of martial law, whether in any part of the country or in the entire country, anytime even without invasion or rebellion. He noted that considering that President Duterte has been issuing proclamations of the same in the entire Mindanao since 2016 as he perceives a "lawless violence" issue therein. Representative Tinio stressed that any President for that matter could use criminality as a basis to declare martial law; hence, he

will never allow "lawless violence" as a justification for such declaration.

VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REPRESENTATIVE TINIO'S AMENDMENT

Thereupon, the Chair called for a *viva voce* voting on the proposed amendment of Representative Tinio, and with majority of the Members voting against, the Body rejected the same.

QUERY FROM THE CHAIR

To the Chair's query, Representative Tinio said that he still had several important amendments particularly on the economic provisions of the proposed Federal Constitution.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 4:31 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:33 p.m.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Upon resumption of session, Representative Hofer acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Reps. Doy C. Leachon, Alfredo "Albee" B. Benitez, Jose Christopher Y. Belmonte, Rogelio "Ruel" D. Pacquiao, and Rodrigo A. Abellanosa.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

At this juncture, the Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 4:35 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:37 p.m.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Whereupon, Representative Tinio proposed to delete the requirement of possessing a college degree as a requirement for holding public office, whether elective or appointive.

Representative Palma rejected the said proposal and Representative Marcoleta adopted the action taken by the Sponsor.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

As Representative Tinio highlighted the provision in the proposed Constitution on diffusion of political power and opportunities to serve in public office, he considered the requirement of having a college degree as an antithesis of the same. He cited that only a small percentage of the student population could earn college degrees every year and he believed that this requirement is “elitist” as it already disqualifies 90% of the populace to run for public office or occupy government positions.

VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REPRESENTATIVE TINIO’S AMENDMENT

Thereupon, the Chair called for a *viva voce* voting on the proposed amendment of Representative Tinio, and with majority of the Members voting against, the Body disapproved the same.

PROPOSED OMNIBUS AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio thereafter proposed to introduce omnibus amendments on Article XIV on the “National Economy and Patrimony.”

POINT OF CLARIFICATION OF DEPUTY SPEAKER CASTRO (F.H.)

On motion of Representative Marcoleta, the Chair then recognized Deputy Speaker Fredenil “Fred” H. Castro who articulated that in an omnibus motion, the proponent shall state all proposed amendments and shall be barred from proposing further amendments which were not included in the omnibus motion. He then asked for a ruling from the Chair on the matter.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 4:44 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:55 p.m.

WITHDRAWAL OF DEPUTY SPEAKER CASTRO’S (F.H.) POINT OF CLARIFICATION

Upon resumption of session, Representative Castro said that after having an intelligent and calm discussion on the nature of the omnibus motion with Representative Tinio, he was withdrawing his point of clarification.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio thereafter proposed to amend Sections 4 and 6 of Article VIII for the inclusion of “three-term limit” and “two-term limit” provisions in R.B.H. No. 15 for the Members of the House of Representatives and Senate, respectively.

Representative Palma rejected the said amendments and Representative Marcoleta adopted the action taken by the Sponsor.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio stated that majority of the public no longer trusts the several attempts to change the Constitution since the time of then former Presidents Fidel V. Ramos and Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo up to the present Administration because tied with these attempts were measures advancing the removal of provisions against political dynasty and dismissing term limits. He said that it is very clear to the people that the motive of the proponents of Charter change is self-serving and that they only want to stay in power perpetually. He thus suggested the retention of the three-term limit.

VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REPRESENTATIVE TINIO’S AMENDMENT

The Chair submitted Representative Tinio’s proposed amendment to a vote, and with the *Nays* having preponderance, the Body rejected the proposal.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio proposed to delete the phrases “such terms and conditions as may be provided by law” and “unless otherwise provided by law” as they appear in Sections 2, 3, and 11 of Article XIV.

Representative Palma rejected the proposed amendment and Representative Marcoleta adopted the action taken by the Sponsor.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio stressed the constitutional provision safeguarding the Filipino people’s ownership and control of the country’s natural and economic resources. He pointed out that the phrases

“under such terms and conditions as may be provided by law” and “unless otherwise provided by law” would allow Congress to amend existing provisions on national economy and patrimony.

VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REPRESENTATIVE TINIO’S AMENDMENT

The Chair then called for a *viva voce* voting on the proposal of Representative Tinio, and with majority of the Members voting against it, the same was lost.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio proposed in Section 3, Article XVII the inclusion, subject to style, of a provision disallowing incumbent elected officials from running for elected positions.

Representative Palma rejected the said proposed amendment and Representative Marcoleta adopted the action taken by the Sponsor.

APPEAL OF REPRESENTATIVE TINIO

Representative Tinio maintained that the proposal to remove the term limit of elected officials and establish a two-party system would only benefit incumbent elected officials, and suggested the inclusion of a provision prohibiting the incumbents from benefitting therefrom.

VIVA VOCE VOTING ON REPRESENTATIVE TINIO’S AMENDMENT

Whereupon, the Chair submitted the proposal of Representative Tinio to a vote, and with the majority voting against it, the amendment was lost.

On motion of Representative Marcoleta, the Chair recognized Rep. Manuel T. Sagarbarria for his proposed amendment.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE SAGARBARRIA

Representative Sagarbarria however manifested to rise on a point of inquiry.

REMARKS OF THE CHAIR

The Chair however stated that the Body was in the period of amendments.

PROPOSED AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE SAGARBARRIA

Representative Sagarbarria first inquired whether the proposed amendment of Representative Tinio on Section 22 of Article II on “genuine agrarian reform” was subjected to a division of the House.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 5:13 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 5:14 p.m.

AMENDMENT OF REPRESENTATIVE SAGARBARRIA

As proposed by Representative Sagarbarria and accepted by the Sponsor, there being no objection, the Body approved to remove in Section 22 of Article II the phrase “genuine agrarian reform”.

way to encouraging participation of private sector developers and non-government organizations (NGOs) in socialized housing projects. She stated that it is clear that the measure favors private sector developers as they would continue to make money to the detriment of low-income homeless families.
