APPROVAL ON THIRD READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 3408

On successive motions of Rep. Ty, there being no objection, the Body proceeded to the approval on Third Reading of House Bill No. 3408, a certified urgent Bill, pursuant to Section 26 (2), Article VI of the Constitution, entitled:

“AN ACT APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THE OPERATION OF THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES FROM JANUARY ONE TO DECEMBER THIRTY-ONE, TWO THOUSAND AND SEVENTEEN, AND FOR OTHER PURPOSES.”

REMARKS OF REP. LAGMAN

Before the Body could proceed with the voting thereon, the Chair recognized Rep. Edcel C. Lagman

who said that he had made a reservation to make a short manifestation after reading of the title of the Bill.

REMARKS OF THE CHAIR

The Chair asked Rep. Lagman to state his manifestation because once the nominal voting had commenced, it could no longer be interrupted.

MANIFESTATION OF REP. LAGMAN

Rep. Lagman said that he sought recognition not to oppose any motion to approve House Bill No. 3408 on Third Reading but to state his reservations on the validity of its approval. He first quoted Section 26 (2), Article VI of the Constitution before citing the following arguments and concluded that the measure did not comply with said constitutional provision:

1. President Rodrigo Roa Duterte and Executive Secretary Salvador Medialdea's letters, both dated October 11, 2016, to Speaker Pantaleon D. Alvarez did not mention any public calamity or emergency requiring the Bill's immediate enactment.
2. The basis of President Duterte's request for the Bill's enactment – maintenance of government operations, quicker funding of projects and programs, and assurance of budgetary preparedness – did not comply with the Constitution's condition of public calamity or emergency. Although the distribution of copies of the printed bill in its final form could be dispensed with in case of a valid certification of urgency, Fiscal Year 2017 was more than two months away.
3. The Members were not shown a copy of the Third Reading version of the Bill that incorporated the amendments approved by the Small Committee tasked to receive and resolve proposed individual amendments to the 2017 General Appropriations Bill (GAB).

On motion of Rep. Defensor, the Chair suspended the session at 6:10 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 6:11 p.m.

MANIFESTATION OF MINORITY LEADER SUAREZ

Recognized by the Chair, on motion of Rep. Defensor, Rep. Danilo E. Suarez said that the Minority will not support Committee Report No. 14 because it lacked the recommendation on what should be done. He added that they will come up with a parallel report and recommendation on the said Resolution.

MANIFESTATION OF REP. ATIENZA

Upon recognition by the Chair, Rep. Jose L. Atienza Jr. agreed with the Minority Leader and pointed out that the Committee Report was incomplete because it offered no conclusions on its findings. He added that it was shaded with partisan interest considering that it did not mention the persons responsible

for the corruption in the National Bilibid Prison (NBP) including the former Justice Secretary.

ADOPTION OF FINDINGS/RECOMMENDATIONS CONTAINED IN COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 14

On motion of Rep. Defensor, there being no objection, the Body adopted the findings/recommendations contained in Committee Report No. 14, as submitted by the Committee on Justice, on House Resolution No. 105.

REFERRAL OF HOUSE RESOLUTIONS ON INQUIRIES IN AID OF LEGISLATION

On motion of Rep. Defensor, there being no objection, the Body approved to refer the following House Resolutions on inquiries in aid of legislation to the appropriate Committees/Special Committees specified hereunder:

1. House Resolution No. 418, on the alleged illegal overcharging of questionable transmission loss fees by the Power Sector Assets and Liabilities Management (PSALM) Corporation on electricity consumers serviced by the Manila Electric Company (Meralco) in the amount of ₱9.1 billion -- to the Committee on Energy;
2. House Resolution No. 419, on the numerous costs and liabilities that the PSALM Corporation is trying to pass on to electricity consumers -- to the Committee on Energy;
3. House Resolution No. 421, on the alleged riot at the New Bilibid Prison that claimed the life of a high-profile inmate and injured four others -- to the Committee on Justice;
4. House Resolution No. 423, on the failure of the Insurance Commission to sanction erring insurance companies on their obligations regarding issued performance bonds -- to the Committee on Banks and Financial Intermediaries;
5. House Resolution No. 425, on the implementation of the Ecological Solid Waste Management Act of 2000 by the National Solid Waste Management Commission -- to the Committee on Ecology;
6. House Resolution No. 427, on the recent riot that occurred at the New Bilibid Prison, Building 14, where one high-profile inmate was killed -- to the Committee on Justice;
7. House Resolution No. 429, on the continuous stay of the Philippine Air Force (PAF) within the Clark Special Economic Zone, in violation of Republic Act No. 7227, otherwise known as the Bases Conversion and Development Act of 1992 -- to the Special Committee on Bases Conversion;
8. House Resolution No. 432, on the conditions of working students hired on part-time employment -- to the Committee on Labor and Employment;
9. House Resolution No. 433, on the series of arson of farmers' houses at Barangay Paradise 3, San Jose Del Monte City, Bulacan, involving the Araneta Properties, Inc. -- to the Committee on Human Rights;
10. House Resolution No. 434, on the September 7 extra-judicial killing of Ariel Ordillo Diaz, Chairperson of Danggayan Dagiti Mannalon Ti Isabela or Dagami-Delfin Albano Chapter -- to the Committee on Human Rights;
11. House Resolution No. 435, on the filing of trumped-up charges against farmers who are resisting land grabbing in Brgy. Asinga-Via, Baggao Town, Cagayan -- to the Committee on Human Rights;
12. House Resolution No. 438, on the institutionalized alternative academic and enrichment programs for out-of-school youth -- to the Committees on Basic Education and Culture, and Higher and Technical Education;
13. House Resolution No. 439, on the nation's preparedness for natural calamities before and after their occurrences -- to the Committee on National Defense and Security;
14. House Resolution No. 441, on the implementation of Republic Act No. 10586, otherwise known as the Anti-Drunk and Drugged Driving Act of 2013 -- to the Committee on Transportation;
15. House Resolution No. 442, on the need to support the lifting of quantitative import restrictions on rice to better attain national food

security -- to the Committee on Agriculture and Food, and Special Committee on Food Security;

16. House Resolution No. 444, on the school-based immunization of tetravalent dengue vaccine of the Department of Health for the purpose of protecting the health and welfare of the public -- to the Committee on Health;
17. House Resolution No. 445, on the necessity for Manila Water Company and Maynilad Water to specify water consumption corresponding to the amount of basic charge as a protection for their customers/clients/end-users -- to the Committee on Government Enterprises and Privatization;
18. House Resolution No. 446, on the proposal on public schools' problems over land titles -- to the Committee on Justice;
19. House Resolution No. 447, on the plan of action on the perennial gridlock at EDSA and illegal practices by bus owners or companies inimical to public interest-- to the Committee on Transportation;
20. House Resolution No. 452, on the multiple human rights violations and sexual harassment resulting from the encampment of the elements of the 50th Infantry Battalion-Philippine Army in the ancestral domain of the Indigenous community in Ag-Agama, Western Lubuagan, Kalinga -- to the Committee on Human Rights;
21. House Resolution No. 455, on the possible massive economic employment in the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office (PSCO) Small Town Lottery Program for drug user surrenderees -- to the Committees on Games and Amusements, and Dangerous Drugs; and
22. House Resolution No. 456, on the illegal drug trading activities in the Province of Zamboanga del Norte -- to the Committee on Dangerous Drugs.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Thereafter, Rep. Defensor acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Reps. Manuel Monsour T. Del Rosario III and Jennifer Austria Barzaga.

ELECTION OF ASSISTANT MINORITY LEADER

Recognized by the Chair, on motion of Minority Leader Suarez, there being no objection, the Body elected Rep. Harlin Neil J. Abayon III as Assistant Minority Leader.

ELECTION OF MINORITY MEMBERS TO THE COMMITTEE ON INDIGENOUS CULTURAL COMMUNITIES AND INDIGENOUS PEOPLES

On motion of Minority Leader Suarez, there being no objection, the Body elected the following Minority Members to the Committee on Indigenous Cultural Communities and Indigenous Peoples.

1. Rep. Arlene B. Arcillas
2. Rep. Cecilia Leonila V. Chavez
3. Rep. Julieta R. Cortuna

At this point, on motion of Rep. Defensor, the Chair recognized Rep. Lagman for a manifestation.

MANIFESTATION OF REP. LAGMAN

Initially, Rep. Lagman stated that he was not aware that the Body would approve Committee Report No. 14 on House Resolution No. 105, as submitted by the Committee on Justice because such an important Resolution should be discussed extensively in plenary session with the Committee Chairperson defending the same; and that he had prepared some questions to ask the latter. Despite Rep. Juan Pablo "Rimpy" P. Bondoc's reply that the Body had already approved the Committee Report with Minority Leader Suarez and Rep. Atienza speaking against it pursuant to Section 17 of the Rules of Procedure Governing Inquiries in Aid of Legislation, Rep. Lagman said that the House should not be accustomed to fast-tracking very important measures.

Rep. Lagman then inquired whether the consideration of Committee Report No. 14 was included in the Reference of Business. Rep. Bondoc replied that everything was done in order and that the Body considered the Report pursuant to Section 17 of the Rules of Procedure Governing Inquiries in Aid of Legislation and to the approval by the Committee on Rules that afternoon to include the Report in the Calendar of Business.

At this point, Rep. Lagman asked for a copy of the Calendar of Business wherein the particular Committee Report No. 14 was included. When his colleague said that he will be given a copy of the Business for the Day, he pointed out that such copies were not circulated to the Members and could have only been confined with the Rules Committee and Majority Leader. He said that earlier that afternoon, he had made a reservation for interpellation with the Majority Leader and Deputy Majority Leaders.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Rep. Bondoc, the Chair suspended the session at 6:25 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 6:37 p.m.

MANIFESTATION OF REP. LAGMAN (Continuation)

Rep. Lagman reiterated that the Members did not have a copy of the Calendar of Business which included Committee Report No. 14 for plenary consideration. Adding that they did not have a complete copy of the Report which included voluminous annexes, he asked how they could vote on it.

Rep. Lagman then congratulated the leadership and members of the Committee on Justice for deciding not to find probable cause nor recommend the prosecution of Senator Leila De Lima for allegedly receiving drug money from the convicts and inmates of the National Bilibid Prison (NBP). He surmised that the Committee decided against the same because under Section 28 (bb) of the House Rules, which he quoted, its jurisdiction was limited to matters directly and principally relating to the administration of justice. He pointed out that the jurisdiction to investigate malfeasance, misfeasance and nonfeasance committed by government officials and employees as well as to find probable cause for the commission of crimes belonged to the Committee on Good Government and Department of Justice, respectively. Reading excerpts from House Resolution No. 105, he added that what the Committee directed was not directly an investigation on the aforementioned allegations against Senator De Lima but an investigation on the failure of the agencies concerned to control and supervise the national penitentiary.

Rep. Lagman whereupon asked why the Committee Report included affidavits and testimonies on the

allegations against Senator De Lima, portions of which he read into the records, as well as findings. He stressed anew that the Committee had no jurisdiction to investigate malfeasance, misfeasance and nonfeasance and to find probable cause and recommend prosecution. He said that he would have wanted to get the Committee Chairperson's reaction to the accusation that his Committee was deferring to the Department of Justice and allowing itself to be used by the Executive Department through said agency.

Rep. Lagman subsequently discussed some recommendations in the Committee Report, opining that (1) the reimposition of the death penalty for drug cases was not necessary because of the pending measure on the reimposition of the same for heinous crimes; (2) the grant of exceptions to some statutes such as the Anti-Wire Tapping Law should be specified; and (3) the change of status of prison guards and personnel to confidential employees will ensnare both innocent and culpable personnel. He concluded that remedial legislation was not the Committee's primary objective; questioned the timing of the investigation on the narcotics trade in the NBP; and opined that the Committee's investigation was an exercise in futility except to align itself with the Executive to shame and vilify a Senator.

At this point, the Chair recognized Majority Leader Rodolfo C. Fariñas.

AUTHORITY OF ALL COMMITTEES TO CONDUCT MEETINGS DURING THE HOUSE RECESS

On motion of Majority Leader Fariñas, there being no objection, the Body approved to authorize all Committees to conduct meetings or public hearings, if deemed necessary, during the House recess from October 22, 2016 to November 6, 2016.

REMARKS OF MAJORITY LEADER FARIÑAS

Rep. Fariñas then thanked and commended the Members for their attendance in 39 sessions since the convening of the 17th Congress on July 25, 2016, citing the daily session average of 257 Members or 88% of total Members; and for their record-setting approval in eight days of the maiden Budget Bill of the Duterte Administration, under the leadership of House Speaker Pantaleon D. Alvarez. He also pointed out that for the first time in history, the Roll Call was conducted and the quorum was established every morning during said eight-day period.

Rep. Fariñas thereafter cited other accomplishments of the Body, thus: filing of 4,000 House Bills and 500 House Resolutions and referral thereof to various Committees; approval of six House Bills on Third Reading; approval of two House Bills on Second Reading; adoption of 21 House Resolutions; adoption of the recommendations of one Committee as a result of the conduct of an investigation in aid of legislation; and delivery of 98 privilege speeches, 85 of which were duly referred to various committees.

On behalf of the Speaker who was on official travel and business to the People's Republic of China, Rep. Fariñas commended and congratulated all the Members for their hard work and dedication with special mention of Senior Deputy Majority Leader Bondoc, Chairman Karlo Alexei B. Nograles and all the Vice-Chairpersons of the Committee on Appropriations, Minority Leader Suarez and the Members from the Minority, and their colleagues from the group of seven independents.

Rep. Fariñas then expressed his hope to make the Seventeenth Congress the best Congress ever.

ADJOURNMENT OF SESSION

On motion of Majority Leader Fariñas, there being no objection, the Chair declared the session adjourned until four o'clock in the afternoon of Monday, November 7, 2016.
