Subject: Further Extension of
Martial Law and
Suspension of the
Privilege of the
Writ of *Habeas Corpus*
in Mindanao

Members of Congress:

Pursuant to Section 18, Article VII of the Philippine Constitution, I write to initiate a further extension of Martial Law and suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* in Mindanao, which first took effect upon my issuance of Proclamation No. 216.

On 18 July 2017, I requested both Houses of the Congress to extend such proclamation of Martial Law and the suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* in the whole of Mindanao for compelling reasons cited in my letter of even date.

On 22 July 2017, the Congress passed Resolution of Both Houses No. 2, extending the subject Martial Law proclamation and suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* until 31 December 2017.

On 08 December 2017, I requested both Houses of Congress to further extend the subject proclamation and suspension of privilege for a period of one (1) year, or from 01 January 2017 to 31 December 2018, or for such other period of time as the Congress may determine.

On 13 December 2017, after a thorough deliberation, the Senate and the House of Representatives, in a joint session, overwhelmingly adopted Resolution of Both Houses No. 4, further extending the period of Martial law and suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* in the entire Mindanao for one year, from 01 January 2018 to 31 December 2018.

On 05 December 2018, I received a letter from Secretary of National Defense Delfin N. Lorenzana, as Martial Law Administrator, requesting for the further extension of Martial Law and the suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* in Mindanao up to 31 December 2019.

I am pleased to inform the Congress that during the Martial Law period, as extended, in Mindanao, we have achieved significant progress in putting the rebellion under control, ushering in substantial economic gains in Mindanao. In a joint security assessment report, General Carlito G. Galvez Jr., the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) Chief of Staff and Martial Law Implementor, and Director-General Oscar D. Albayalde, Chief of the Philippine National Police (PNP), highlighted the following accomplishments, among others, owing to the implementation of Martial Law in Mindanao: reduction of the capabilities of different terrorist groups, particularly the neutralization of 685 members of the local terrorist groups (LTG) and 1,073 members of the communist terrorist group (CTG); dismantling of seven (7) guerilla fronts and weakening of nineteen (19) others; surrender of unprecedented number of loose firearms (more than eight thousand from January to November 2018); 19% reduction of atrocities committed by CTG in 2018 compared to those inflicted in 2017; 29% reduction of terrorist

acts committed by LTG in 2018 compared to 2017; and substantial decrease in crime incidence (Cotabato City – 51 % reduction and Maguindanao – 38 % reduction). All of these gains in security and peace and order have resulted in remarkable economic gains in Mindanao. In fact, private sectors, local and regional peace and order councils, and local government units in Mindanao are now also clamoring for a further extension of the subject proclamation and suspension.

Notwithstanding these gains, the security assessment submitted by the AFP and PNP highlights certain essential facts which indicate that rebellion still persists in Mindanao and that public safety requires the continuation of Martial Law in the whole of Mindanao.

The Abu Sayyaf Group, Bangsamoro Islamic Freedom Fighters, Daulah Islamiyah (DI), and other terrorist groups (collectively labeled as LTG) which seek to promote global rebellion, continue to defy the government by perpetrating hostile activities during the extended period of Martial Law. At least four (4) bombings/Improvised Explosive Device (IED) explosions had been cited in the AFP report. The Lamitan City bombing on 31 July 2018 that killed eleven (11) individuals and wounded ten (10) others, the Isulan, Sultan Kudarat IED explosion on 28 August and 02 September 2018 that killed five (5) individuals and wounded forty-five (45) others, and the Barangay Apopong IED explosion that left eight (8) individuals wounded.

The DI forces continue to pursue their rebellion against the government by furthering the conduct of their radicalization activities, and continuing to recruit new members, especially in vulnerable Muslim communities.

While the government was preoccupied in addressing the challenges posed by said groups, the CTG, which has publicly declared its intention to seize political power through violent means and supplant the country's democratic form of government with Communist rule, took advantage and likewise posed serious security concerns. Records disclosed that at least three hundred forty-two (342) violent incidents, ranging from harassments against government installations, liquidation operations, and arson attacks as part of extortion schemes, which occurred mostly in Eastern Mindanao, had been perpetrated from 01 January 2018 to 30 November 2018. About twenty-three (23) arson incidents had been recorded and it had been estimated that the amount of the properties destroyed in Mindanao alone has reached One Hundred Fifty-Six

(156) Million Pesos. On the part of the military, the atrocities resulted in the killing of eighty-seven (87) military personnel and wounding of four hundred eight (408) others.

Apart from these, major Abu Sayyaf Group factions in Sulu continue to pursue kidnap for ransom activities to finance their operations. As of counting, there are a total of eight (8) kidnappings that have occurred involving a Dutch, a Vietnamese, two (2) Indonesians, and four (4) Filipinos.

The foregoing merely illustrates in general terms the continuing rebellion in Mindanao. I will be submitting a more detailed report on the subsisting rebellion in the next few days.

A further extension of the implementation of Martial Law and suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* in Mindanao will enable the AFP, the PNP, and all other law enforcement agencies to finally put an end to the on-going rebellion in Mindanao and continue to prevent the same from escalating in other parts of the country. We cannot afford to give the rebels any further breathing room to regroup and strengthen their forces. Public safety indubitably requires such further extension in order to avoid the further loss of lives and physical harm, not only to our soldiers and the police, but also to our civilians. Such extension will also enable the government and the people of Mindanao to sustain the gains we have achieved thus far, ensure the complete rehabilitation of the most affected areas therein, and preserve the socio-economic growth and development now happening in Mindanao.

For all the foregoing reasons, I implore the Congress of the Philippines to further extend the proclamation of Martial Law and the suspension of the privilege of the writ of *habeas corpus* in the whole of Mindanao for a period of one (1) more year, from 01 January 2019 to 31 December 2019, or for such other period of time as the Congress may determine, in accordance with Section 18, Article VII of the 1987 Philippine Constitution.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.P.), the Chair recognized Majority Leader Rolando G. Andaya Jr. to deliver his question of personal and collective privilege.

QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

Majority Leader Andaya noted how in the past few days, the media has wrongly maligned the House and its leadership in the exercise of its inherent and constitutional power and has raised the issue of alleged big allocations for the allies of the present Speaker. He reminded his colleagues that when the 2019 National Expenditure Program was submitted to the House, it was done under the previous House leadership, and logic dictates that the large district allocations would be for their allies, and not of the present leadership.

He thereafter refuted the statement of the Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Secretary that a delayed budget will result in economic slowdown, as he emphasized that budgeting is about revenues and not expenditures. He added that the use of a delayed and smaller amount of budget will depend on the DBM leadership and not Congress. He then cited the huge increase in the 2018 budget for flood control under the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH), part of which was given to the Lone District of Catanduanes and the Second District of Sorsogon which did not request for such budgetary item. He opined that they were given allocations simply because the 2018 budget was hastily passed, and it was said to carry an instruction from the Executive not to touch said amount to deny concerned Congressmen any information on the use of said funds.

Majority Leader Andaya also raised the issue of a contractor operating a construction business not as a corporation but as a single proprietorship which was not in accordance with the law as the contracts involved projects worth billions of pesos. He said that the contractor’s business is located in Bulacan and yet it was able to corner DPWH projects located

in Sorsogon and Catanduanes. He stated that a miracle must have happened in the awarding of contracts.

Knowing that many Members have encountered the same experience, he then enjoined his colleagues to stand up as one voice and expose the anomalies in the budget. As he bemoaned the fact that they have been misunderstood and maligned all these years thereby decreasing their influence over the budget, he said that it is about time that they retake the power of the purse.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.P.), the Chair recognized Rep. Anthony M. Bravo, PhD for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE BRAVO (A.)

Citing the huge unused appropriations in the 2016 and 2017 General Appropriations Acts (GAA), Representative Bravo discussed with Majority Leader Andaya the reporting system of the DBM as regards the declared savings of the government in which he raised the question of how a particular item in the budget can be augmented if there was no declared savings by the government.

Majority Leader Andaya informed the Body that he had a meeting with DPWH Undersecretary Ma. Catalina E. Cabral who told him that the agency had declared savings since January. He stated that savings is a big source of additional funding for the Executive under the direct control of the DBM. He then said that the House has invited DBM Secretary Benjamin E. Diokno to appear before the House during a Question Hour the following day but the latter begged for more time as he needed to gather more data. He then enjoined Representative Bravo and the other Members to raise their concerns to the DBM Secretary once he appears before the House.

Representative Bravo called on DBM Secretary Diokno to appear before the House and for the Committee on Public Accounts to investigate the matter, to which Majority Leader Andaya affirmed that the said Committee will spearhead the Question Hour.

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Gonzales (A.P.), there being no objection, the Body referred the speech of Majority Leader Andaya to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

TO THE COMMITTEE ON RULES

PRIVILEGE HOUR

It being a Monday, on motion of Rep. Jericho Jonas B. Nograles, there being no objection, the

Chair declared a Privilege Hour and thereafter recognized Rep. Milagros Aquino-Magsaysay for her privilege speech.

**PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF
REPRESENTATIVE AQUINO-MAGSAYSAY**

Representative Aquino-Magsaysay stressed the importance and advantages of using renewable energy sources as against fossil fuel-powered energy sources in line with the thrust of Republic Act (R.A.) No. 9513 or the Renewable Energy Act of 2008 that was enacted during the presidency of Speaker Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo

Shen then focused her speech on the construction of a coal-fired power plant by the Global Luzon Energy Development Corporation in her town of Luna in La Union and raised several issues on the matter including, among others: (1) how said construction would jeopardize the economy and environment of the province; (2) the irreversible impact and long-term risks of coal-fired power plants not just to the environment, but most especially to the health of people especially of children and the elderly; and (3) how the use of solar, wind, and geothermal energies could be the more sustainable, cheaper, convenient, and cleaner options for power generation.

Representative Aquino-Magsaysay urged her colleagues to come up with specific solutions to decrease, if not totally eradicate, the country's dependence on coal energy and asked the Committee on Energy to look into strengthening the mandate of the Renewable Energy Act.

**REFERRAL OF
THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF
REPRESENTATIVE AQUINO-MAGSAYSAY**

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Aquino-Magsaysay to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

Thereupon, on another motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Chair recognized Rep. Aurora Enerio Cerilles for her privilege speech.

**PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF
REPRESENTATIVE CERILLES**

Representative Cerilles initially recalled her previous privilege speech which exposed the injustice done by the National Police Commission (NAPOLCOM) against Zamboanga del Sur Governor

Antonio H. Cerilles when it issued *En Banc* Resolution No. 2017-571 stripping off his NAPOLCOM deputation based on a confidential report, and how said deputation withdrawal had caused him to be tagged in newspaper headlines as among the so-called “narco-politicians.”

She then shared that in a hearing recently conducted by the Committee on Public Order and Safety, some officials from the provincial police and military and the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency had cleared Governor Cerilles from the narco-list. She also described how illegal quarrying and gambling activities worsened in Zamboanga del Sur after the withdrawal of Governor Cerilles’ NAPOLCOM deputation and the deactivation of the provincial Anti-Illegal Gambling Task Force. She alleged that the acting PNP provincial director’s disinterest in addressing said problem and his solicitation of monetary contributions from authorized agents of the Philippine Charity Sweepstakes Office have exacerbated the situation.

Subsequently, Representative Cerilles asked the government to seriously look into the matter.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CERILLES

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Cerilles’ privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CASILAO

Next recognized by the Chair upon motion of Representative Nograles, Rep. Ariel “Ka Ayik” B. Casilao cited the worldwide commemoration of Human Rights Day as he condemned the recent killing and burning of nine farmers in Sagay, Negros Occidental. He stressed that this is a continuation of the decades-long slaughter of farmers as a reprisal for the assertion of their right to land, despite the fact that they produce food and feed the nation.

He pointed out that throughout history, the government has made farmers, indigenous peoples, and the poor sector a scapegoat for its inability to grant them genuine land reform and improve their condition; and has addressed their concerns with violence and conspiracies with landowners and private groups and businesses.

Thereupon, Representative Casilao called for an end to the attacks against the people; implementation of genuine agrarian reform; free land distribution; and justice for the victims of the aforesaid Sagay massacre.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CASILAO

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Casilao’s privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ZARATE

Then recognized by the Chair upon motion of Representative Nograles, Rep. Carlos Isagani T. Zarate likewise cited the 70th year of the adoption of the Declaration of Human Rights in the world as he decried the killing of thousands of drug personalities under the Duterte Administration. He also denounced the employment by State agents of harassment, violence, and killing to address farmers who assert their rights to the land they till; workers who fight for living wages and security of tenure; lawyers such as Atty. Ben Ramos who had been recently killed, who defended human rights victims; and Members of the House such as Rep. France L. Castro and former Rep. Satur Ocampo, who conduct solidarity missions in Lumad communities.

Representative Zarate pointed out that in celebration of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, the Duterte Administration has asked Congress for the extension of martial law in Mindanao despite the many cases of killings committed by soldiers and paramilitary forces. He recalled the 9th anniversary of the Ampatuan massacre and noted that justice for the victims still seems elusive; reminded the Philippine National Police that those who ruin their image also come from their own ranks; and asked the Members to give justice to the victims of dictatorship and human rights violation, end impunity, and stop the extrajudicial killings.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ZARATE

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Zarate to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

EXTENSION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body extended the Privilege Hour for another 20 minutes.

SUSPENSION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

Likewise, on successive motions of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body suspended the Privilege Hour, and the Chair thereafter recognized Minority Leader Danilo E. Suarez.

ELECTION OF REPRESENTATIVE GARCES TO THE COMMITTEE ON YOUTH AND SPORTS DEVELOPMENT

On the part of the Majority, on motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body elected Rep. Ulysses G. Garces as a member of the Committee on Youth and Sports Development.

INSERTION OF REPRESENTATIVE BROSAS' EXPLANATION OF VOTE

On motion of Rep. Arlene D. Brosas and seconded by Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body approved to insert into the records, the former's explanation of vote on House Bill No. 8655 which seeks to amend R.A. No. 9262 or the Anti-Violence Against Women and Their Children Act of 2004.

RESUMPTION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body resumed the Privilege Hour and on his further motion, the Chair recognized Rep. Sarah Jane I. Elago for her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ELAGO

Representative Elago expounded on the continuing and important task of promoting the fundamental right to education and the pursuit of free public education at all levels. She lamented that despite the passage of R.A. No. 10931 or the Universal Access to Quality Tertiary Education, tuition and other fees are still being collected in state universities and colleges (SUCs) and local universities and colleges (LUCs). She disclosed that in the implementation of R.A. No. 10931, the UniFAST Board has released its implementing rules and regulations which limited the list of other school fees (OSF) subsidized by the national government to 13, and charged to the expense of the students the OSF not listed which is totally opposed the essence of the provisions of R.A. No. 10931.

At this juncture, Deputy Speaker Escudero relinquished the Chair to Representative Nograles.

She asked the Members to forge strong unity and step up the fight against maneuvers skirting free education, assess the overall Philippine education system, and plan for their next steps. She called on the Committees on Basic Education and Culture, Higher and Technical Education, and Youth and Sports Development to tackle the myriad concerns of stakeholders of the education community from attacks against democratic rights to militarization of schools. She likewise urged the Oversight Committee on R.A. No. 10931 to convene the soonest and take immediate action that can stop the unconscionable move of turning free education into a scam, and defend the right of the youth to free and quality education.

At this point, Representative Nograles relinquished the Chair to Deputy Speaker Escudero.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ELAGO

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Elago to the Committee on Rules for its proper action.

TERMINATION OF PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.

ADJOURNMENT OF SESSION

On motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Chair declared the session adjourned until three o'clock in the afternoon of Tuesday, December 11, 2018.
