On motion of Deputy Speaker Castro (F.H.), there being no objection, the Body elected Mr.

Dante Roberto P. Maling as Acting Secretary General of the House.

ELECTION OF SERGEANT-AT-ARMS

On another motion of Deputy Speaker Castro (F.H.), there being no objection, the Body elected Ret. Maj. Gen. Romeo C. Prestoza as Sergeant-at-Arms of the House.

ELECTION OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

On a subsequent motion of Deputy Speaker Castro (F.H.), there being no objection, the Body elected Rep. Rolando G. Andaya Jr. as Chairperson of the Committee on Rules vice Rep. Rodolfo C. Fariñas.

POINT OF ORDER OF REPRESENTATIVE FARIÑAS

Upon recognition by the Chair, Representative Fariñas pointed out that the newly-elected Majority Leader should not be presiding over the session.

Majority Leader Andaya stated he was about to relinquish the Chair.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY OF REPRESENTATIVE ERICE

Rep. Edgar R. Erice sought recognition from the Chair on a parliamentary inquiry but the Chair replied that he was about to take his oath as the new Majority Leader. Representative Erice then requested to be recognized first before the said oath-taking.

Recognized by the Chair, Representative Erice inquired whether the House was reconstituting itself by electing a new Majority Leader, Acting Secretary General, and Sergeant-at-Arms. The Chair replied that they are merely reorganizing the House of Representatives.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair then *motu proprio* suspended the session at 4:15 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:21 p.m. with Speaker Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo presiding.

**MOTION OF
DEPUTY SPEAKER CASTRO (F.H.)**

Deputy Speaker Castro then moved that the Body proceed with the oath-taking of the duly elected officials of the House.

**MANIFESTATION OF
REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN**

Rep. Tom S. Villarín manifested his desire to raise a parliamentary inquiry.

**REMARKS OF
MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA**

Majority Leader Andaya affirmed Representative Castro's (F.H.) motion.

**MANIFESTATION OF
REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

Thereupon, Rep. Antonio L. Tinio manifested his desire to raise a point of order.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

At 4:22 p.m., the Chair suspended the session upon Majority Leader Andaya's motion.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 4:26 p.m., the session resumed with Deputy Speaker Castro (F.H.) presiding.

**POINT OF ORDER OF
REPRESENTATIVE TINIO**

On motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair then recognized Representative Tinio who read into the records Section 8, Rule II of the amended Provisional Rules of the House which states that Members who vote for the winning candidate for Speaker shall constitute the Majority in the House and shall elect from among themselves the Majority Leader; and that the Majority Leader may be changed at any time by a majority of the Members.

He added that in the previous session, the Body adopted House Resolution No. 2025 which inserted into the records the results of voting for the speakership and which contained the names of the 184 Members who had voted for Representative Macapagal-Arroyo to said position.

He then asked why the nomination of the Majority Leader was placed before the entire Body instead of the aforementioned 184 Members who constituted the Majority.

**REMARKS OF
MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA**

Majority Leader Andaya remarked that the point of order should deal with the issue at hand or the oath-taking of the newly-elected officers of the House. He asked whether Representative Tinio wanted to convert his point of order into a question of privilege.

RULING OF THE CHAIR

The Chair then ruled that Representative Tinio's point of order was out of order and sustained the position of Majority Leader Andaya.

**MANIFESTATION OF
REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN**

Representative Villarín manifested his intent, at this point, to raise a parliamentary inquiry.

**OATH-TAKING OF
NEWLY-ELECTED OFFICIALS
OF THE HOUSE**

On motion of Majority Leader Andaya, there being no objection, the Body proceeded to the oath-taking of the newly-elected officials of the House.

**MANIFESTATION OF
REPRESENTATIVE ERICE**

During the oath-taking of the Sergeant-at-Arms, Rep. Edgar R. Erice manifested his desire to raise a point of order; but Majority Leader Andaya asked the Members to refrain from interrupting the proceedings.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

Upon Majority Leader Andaya's motion, the Chair declared a recess at 4:31 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:33 p.m. with Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo presiding.

**OATH-TAKING OF
SERGEANT-AT-ARMS PRESTOZA**

Upon Majority Leader Andaya's motion, there being no objection, Ret. Major Gen. Romeo C. Prestoza ascended the rostrum and took his oath of office as the newly elected Sergeant-at Arms of the House before Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 4:35 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 4:35 p.m., the session resumed.

OATH-TAKING OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

On motion of Deputy Speaker Castro, there being no objection, Majority Leader Andaya ascended the rostrum and took his oath of office as the newly elected Majority Leader of the House before Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

At 4:37 p.m., the Chair *motu proprio* declared a recess anew.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 4:38 p.m., the session resumed with Deputy Speaker Castro (F.H.) presiding.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY OF REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN

Upon Majority Leader Andaya's motion, the Chair recognized Representative Villarín on a parliamentary inquiry.

Representative Villarín inquired whether a majority caucus was held to elect a Majority Leader.

With the permission of the Chair, Majority Leader Andaya disclosed that the present situation was that a motion was made to elect a new Majority Leader which was unanimously voted upon without objection.

Considering that the election of the Majority Leader was affirmed in the plenary that time, Representative Villarín asked whether the 184 Members who voted for the Speaker constituted the present majority or a new majority has been constituted that was beyond the 184 Members.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair suspended the session at 4:41 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:46 p.m.

REMARKS OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

In response to Representative Villarín's inquiry, Majority Leader Andaya informed the Body that the Majority bloc recognizes 260 Members as part of

the Majority, 17 Members as part of the Minority, seven from the Independent bloc, seven from the Independent-Makabayan bloc, and one independent in the name of Rep. Tobias "Toby" M. Tiangco, or a total of 292 Members.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY OF REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN (Continuation)

Representative Villarín cited Section 8 of the amended Provisional Rules of the House on who constitutes the Majority in the House and as per House Resolution No. 2025, the 184 Members who voted for the winning Speaker constitute the Majority. He then read for the record the names of the members of the Minority who voted for Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

At this point, Rep. Rodante D. Marcoleta sought recognition on a point of order.

PARLIAMENTARY INQUIRY OF REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN (Continuation)

Representative Villarín asked Majority Leader Andaya to confirm whether the 14 Members of the Minority he enumerated voted for Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo.

POINT OF ORDER OF REPRESENTATIVE MARCOLETA

Upon recognition by the Chair, Representative Marcoleta stated that a parliamentary inquiry was not subject of debate.

Representative Villarín said that considering that it was in the records of the House, he would like to affirm the Members who constitute the Majority. Representative Marcoleta reiterated his point of order, citing that the Majority Leader had already explained the matter and therefore can no longer be a matter of debate.

REMARKS OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

With the permission of the Chair, Majority Leader Andaya confirmed that the 184 Members who unanimously voted for the lone and solitary candidate for the Speaker in the recent reorganization of the House, not in the initial constitution of the House as enumerated under Rule II of the amended Provisional Rules of the House, constitute the Majority.

Representative Villarín asked the opinion of the Majority Leader whether in essence an election for the Speaker had ensued.

At this point, Majority Leader Andaya acknowledged Representative Villarín's manifestation.

On whether the 14 Minority members who voted for the Speaker would now be considered with the Majority, Majority Leader Andaya said that he was only affirming Representative Villarín's manifestation. He asked Representative Villarín whether he would like to convert his manifestation into a point of order.

REMARKS OF THE CHAIR

Noting that Majority Leader Andaya already explained his side of Representative Villarín's position, the Chair sustained the Majority Leader's response thereon.

ELECTION OF MAJORITY MEMBERS

On motion of Majority Leader Andaya, there being no objection, the Body elected the following members of the Majority to the Committees specified hereunder:

Committee on Rules:

Rep. Rodante D. Marcoleta vice Rep. Juan Pablo "Rimpy" P. Bondoc

Committee on Accounts:

Rep. Yedda Marie K. Romualdez vice Rep. Elenita Milagros "Eileen" Ermita-Buhain

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair suspended the session at 4:52 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:55 p.m.

MOTION OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

At this point, Majority Leader Andaya moved to recognize Minority Leader Danilo E. Suarez, and the Chair did so.

OBJECTION OF DEPUTY SPEAKER QUIMBO

Deputy Speaker Romero "Miro" S. Quimbo objected to the statement of Majority Leader Andaya.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ERICE

Rep. Edgar R. Erice sought recognition from the Chair on a point of order.

REMARKS OF MINORITY LEADER SUAREZ

Upon recognition by the Chair, Minority Leader Suarez initially greeted his colleagues in the House.

MANIFESTATIONS OF REPRESENTATIVES ERICE AND QUIMBO

Representatives Erice and Quimbo sought recognition to reiterate anew their point of order and objection, respectively.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair suspended the session at 4:55 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:57 p.m.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE QUIMBO

On motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair recognized Representative Quimbo who stated for the record that on July 25, 2018, a day after the election of former President Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo as the new Speaker of the House, and on July 30, pursuant to Section 8 of the amended Provisional House Rules, the following Members organized themselves as members of the Minority, elected a Minority Leader, and informed Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo on the matter: Reps. Francis Gerald A. Abaya, Kaka J. Bag-ao, Teddy Brawner Baguilat Jr., Jorge "Bolet" Banal, Jose Christopher Y. Belmonte, Gabriel H. Bordado Jr, Arlene D. Brosas, Raul A. Daza, Christopher V.P. de Venecia, Edgar R. Erice, Edcel C. Lagman, Jocelyn Sy Limkaichong, Romero "Miro" S. Quimbo, Antonio L. Tinio, Carlos Isagani T. Zarate, Gary C. Alejano, Ariel "Ka Ayik" B. Casilao, France L. Castro, Emmi A. De Jesus, Sarah Jane I. Elago, Josephine Ramirez-Sato, and Tom S. Villarín.

Whereupon, Representative Quimbo manifested to put on record that they have organized as the recognized Minority based on the voting last July 23, 2018 and are ready to work with the Majority. He objected to the earlier referral of the Majority Leader to another person as being the Minority Leader as he pointed out that recognizing somebody else as Minority Leader violates Section 8 of the amended provisional Rules of the House. He congratulated the former Minority Leader, those who voted for the new Speaker, as well as the newly elected Speaker but clearly pointed out that their support for the Speaker was unequivocal and there was a clear abandonment of their previous posts. However, he averred that as far they are concerned, the Minority is expected to be the one to exercise all the checks and balance. He asked how the institution can perform these functions if the Minority cannot be trusted.

Representative Quimbo stressed that their group was organized in accordance with the House

Rules and even cited the decision of the Supreme Court on the case of Rep. Teddy Brawner Baguilat Jr. which clarified that Members of the Majority constitute those who voted for the winning Speaker and Members of the Minority constitute those who voted for the non-winning candidates as well as those who abstained. He opined that the Rule applies every time a vote for the speakership is made. He said that the election of Rep. Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo on July 23, 2018 was confirmed with the adoption of House Resolution No. 2025, and that there were not just twelve (12) but actually fifteen (15) Members who abstained or voted “No.”

As Representative Quimbo then pointed out that it is clearly a defining moment each time the Body selects someone or when there is a tussle for the speakership, he said probably one reason why many of them supported the very abrupt and quick change was because of a particular nuance they were not happy with. He then appealed to his colleagues to start on the right foot and underscored that they are the duly constituted Minority.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ERICE

Recognized by the Chair, Representative Erice moved that the new Minority Leader take his oath of office.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The Chair *motu proprio* suspended the session at 5:06 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 5:06 p.m.

REMARKS OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

To allow an orderly proceeding, Majority Leader Andaya stated that Representative Erice, and Reps. Alfredo A. Garbin Jr., Jose L. Atienza Jr., and Edcel C. Lagman shall be recognized in this order.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE GARBIN

Next recognized by the Chair upon Majority Leader Andaya’s motion, Representative Garbin stated that in order for the Body to reach a better conclusion in arriving at the correct interpretation of the rules of procedure, they should read the

House Rules in its entirety, and not only focus on Section 8, Rule II. He cited Section 8, Rule II stating that the determination of who constitutes the Majority and Minority applies during the opening of Congress and initial election of Speaker, and not during subsequent change of leadership during the existing Congress. He then explained the arrangement of the Rules of the House as follows: Rule I, which refers to Convening and Organizing the House; Rule II, refers to Membership wherein the section governing the determination of Majority and Minority is indicated, and Rule III, which refers to the Officers of the House and their election.

Representative Garbin underscored that this implies that the initial determination of who constitutes the Majority and Minority in the House only applies when the House is initially convened, otherwise, Rule II determining who constitutes Majority and Minority or at least Section 8 of the same Rule will be included in Rule III after Rule III for that matter. As he cited Rule III of the Rules of the House, he stated that declaring the seat of the Speaker as vacant under Rule III as a matter of business only for the members of the Majority is wrong because the Rules clearly states that it needs a majority vote of all Members of Congress and it includes members of the Minority. He admitted that many members of the Minority voted for the winning Speaker and there were those who did not vote or participate in the election. However, he clarified that it did not change and will never change the membership status of each and every Member regardless of whether he/she voted for the winning Speaker or did not participate in the said proceedings. He then cited the cases of Reps. Dakila Carlo E. Cua, Reynaldo V. Umali, Arnel U. Ty, and Rodolfo T. Albano III, who still hold the chairmanships of their respective Committees.

In closing, Representative Garbin stressed why the Body will strictly construe the provision against the Minority who voted for Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo and liberally construed the provisions of the House Rules in favor of those who did not support her as he underscored that there is no automatic change in the membership status regardless who they voted for. The Chair took note of his manifestation.

MOTION OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

Majority Leader Andaya moved to convert the manifestation of Representative Quimbo into a privilege speech to allow a full-blown debate on the matter.

There being no objection, the motion was carried.

Thereafter, on motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair again recognized Representative Quimbo for his reply.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE QUIMBO

As a rejoinder, Representative Quimbo refuted what Representative Garbin said that the issue at hand will not apply, or as a basic parliamentary procedure or be internationally-recognized even in the smallest countries of Africa that when you vote in the majority or vote for the winning Speaker, you belong to the Majority and that it only applies when the Body was first established or constituted. He pointed out that Rule 2 on Membership, covered everything and disagreed with the contention of Representative Garbin that the Rule is only for the constitution or their organization on their very first session. He also underscored that when Members took sides, they have already determined what character they will represent in the House of Representatives.

Furthermore, Representative Quimbo disproved the argument of Representative Garbin when he cited Section 13, which refers that only the following officers, namely: the Secretary General, Deputy Speakers, and Sergeant-at-Arms can be replaced by a vote of the majority. He said that the position of Speaker is exempted from this Rule because it is elected by the majority through *viva voce* or nominal voting and nowhere was it mentioned how the Minority Leader can be replaced. He stated that all of this is subject to the will of the Majority but the Minority cannot be raided or dislodged by the Majority.

As he inquired on the independence of the Minority, he stressed that they have the greater number of members, and asked his colleagues under the new leadership to take the right step by following the Rules of the House.

At this, point, Majority Leader Andaya recognized Representative Garbin.

QUERY FROM THE CHAIR

The Chair inquired whether Representative Garbin was rising in response to Representative Quimbo, or taking the floor as a rejoinder. Representative Garbin cited the second reason.

REJOINDER OF REPRESENTATIVE GARBIN

Representative Garbin stressed that the Body was now under a duly-constituted House of Representatives, with a Majority, and a Minority, under the leadership of Representative Suarez, which was

also constituted in the First Regular Session of the 17th Congress. He cited the Supreme Court ruling in the case of *Baguilat vs. Alvarez*, and maintained that the status of the Minority group under Representative Suarez has not changed. He said that the declaration of vacancy of the Speakership was not just the business of the members of the Majority but by the majority of all the Members of the House.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Recognized by the Chair on motion of Majority Leader Andaya, Rep. Jose L. Atienza Jr. manifested that 1) Representative Quimbo had misinterpreted the Rules of the House, and that his group does not speak for the greater majority in the Chamber and therefore could not declare the position of the Minority Leader vacant; 2) the Body at this point is in a state of limbo because of a group wanting to contest the leadership of the Minority Leader; 3) he belongs to the Minority, and had been an active Minority Leader as the first Deputy Minority Leader; 4) there was no need to declare the position of the Minority Leader vacant because there was no vacancy; 5) the Members who participated in the election of Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo merely answered their call of duty, thus former Speaker Pantaleon D. Alvarez illegally took his seat as Speaker during his term because he abstained from voting for the Speaker in the July 25, 2016 elections; 6) Representative Suarez at that time merely followed the Rules, and requested to join the Minority because he merely exercised *delicadeza* in voting for his opponent; 7) the Members should refrain from using their time in plenary session with matters that should be resolved only by the members of the Minority; and 8) leadership is earned and not imposed.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE QUIMBO

Representative Quimbo manifested his desire to respond to Representative Atienza's statement, which he opined was in the nature of a privilege speech.

REMARKS OF THE CHAIR

The Chair however stated that Representative Atienza took the floor on a manifestation.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza clarified that he rose on a manifestation, but that he was willing to have a debate with Representative Quimbo any time on the issue.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE QUIMBO

Representative Quimbo sought recognition on a point of clarification.

At this point, Rep. Cristina “Chiqui” Roa-Puno moved for the recognition of Rep. Edcel C. Lagman.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE QUIMBO

Representative Quimbo stated that he had not been able to respond to Representative Atienza.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN

Representative Lagman said that before pursuing his interpellation, the Body owes Representative Quimbo the opportunity to answer the points raised by Representative Atienza as they were in the nature of an interpellation.

Representative Roa-Puno moved anew for the recognition of Representative Quimbo.

QUERY FROM THE CHAIR

The Chair inquired whether Representative Lagman was yielding his time to Representative Quimbo.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN

Representative Lagman answered in the negative, this as he stressed that he rose to interpellate and would not yield his time. However, he opined that any manifestation or privilege speech is subject to interpellation.

REMARKS OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

Representative Andaya stated that the Body was merely giving Representative Quimbo the time to respond to Representative Atienza, after which Representative Lagman would have his turn to interpellate Representative Quimbo.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN

Representative Lagman, in response to the Majority Leader, said that he would give way to Representative Quimbo.

Majority Leader Andaya thereafter moved for the recognition of Representative Quimbo.

REMARKS OF THE CHAIR

The Chair stated that a manifestation was not an interpellation, and thereafter recognized Representative Quimbo to respond to Representative Atienza’s manifestation.

REMARKS OF REPRESENTATIVE QUIMBO

Representative Quimbo clarified that he was not seeking to change the Rules of the House, but merely implementing them. He said that the Rules were clear, which were clarified in the voting for the Speaker by Representative Atienza himself when he sought explanation on who becomes part of the Minority or the Majority when the 17th Congress opened its inaugural session. He underscored that said query was responded to by then interim Majority Leader Fariñas—that the Member who voted for the winner belongs to the Majority, while the Member who voted for the loser belongs to the Minority. He said that his group abandoned traditions and followed the Rules, proving Representative Fariñas correct, and which opinion the Supreme Court had also ruled correct. He asked how the members of the Minority would accept his group when they could have them dislodged because they have the bigger number. Contrary to the statement that the Body was in a state of limbo, he underscored that they would like to begin with their new task, and agreed that leadership is earned but never bought.

On motion of Rep. Magnolia C. Antonino, the Chair recognized Representative Lagman for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN

Representative Lagman inquired whether the resurrection of Representative Suarez as “Minority Leader” was a patent heresy, and was nil and inconceivable. He opined that Representative Suarez and his group dug their own grave when they voted for Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo, and should not be allowed to perpetuate their charade of being the institutional Minority after being anointed by former Speaker Pantaleon D. Alvarez and his Super Majority as the Majority’s Minority.

As he affirmed that those who voted for the winning Speaker shall become part of the Majority under Section 8 of the amended Provisional Rules of the House, Representative Quimbo stated that he cannot find any legal or moral justification that Representative Suarez will remain as Minority

Leader since he and his group had voted for the election of Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo. He surmised that there is a clear intent on the part of Representative Suarez and his group to stay and position themselves in critical positions in the House and that it is not good for the new leadership as it would taint the integrity of the House.

As to the validity that all other positions in the House including that of the Minority Leader should remain the same considering that only the position of the Speaker was declared vacant, both Members agreed that any change in the leadership would necessarily result in changes in the composition of the members of the Majority and Minority. Representative Lagman pointed out that the Supreme Court had ruled that the election of the Speaker will determine the membership of the Majority and the Minority.

Representative Quimbo emphasized that Sections 8 and 13 of the amended Provisional Rules of the House cannot be invoked as it provides a clear enumeration of positions that can be declared vacant by virtue of the vote of the Majority and that the position of the Minority Leader cannot be declared vacant by the vote of the Majority. He also affirmed that what was constituted at the beginning of any Congress can be altered by subsequent election of a new Speaker.

On the case of the abstention vote of former Speaker Pantaleon D. Alvarez when he was elected, Representative Quimbo affirmed that the rule on those who abstain shall belong to the Minority came only after the voting for the Speakership was held. He added that the abstention vote of the former was ineffectual because he had the overwhelming majority votes for Speakership.

QUESTION OF QUORUM OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Representative Atienza questioned the presence of a quorum noticing that there were only 100 Members present on the floor. He then stated that the Body should adjourn its session.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The session was suspended at 5:53 p.m. upon motion of Majority Leader Andaya.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 5:57 p.m.

Thereupon, on motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair recognized Representative Quimbo.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE QUIMBO

Representative Quimbo stated that he cannot refuse the request of Majority Leader Andaya to suspend the interpellations on his privilege speech with the assurance that it would continue the next day.

Thereafter, on motion of Majority Leader Andaya, the Chair recognized Representative Fariñas on a manifestation.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE FARIÑAS

At the outset, Representative Fariñas stated that he would also like to manifest his side regarding Representative Suarez' retention as the Minority Leader. He also wants to be clarified with regard to the membership of the Minority when in fact, he as well as his 12 colleagues wrote to the Speaker and the Minority Leader as he expressed belief that the acting Minority Leader should be Rep. Eugene Michael B. De Vera because all the members of the Minority had voted with the Majority. He stated that he would raise said concerns the next day and informed the Body that the one who questioned the quorum, Representative Atienza, was the former Senior Deputy Minority Leader who claimed that he is still with the Minority. He said that it is unfair that they will not be given an opportunity to discuss the matter considering that they questioned the quorum after they have given their manifestations on the matter.

He then asked who will be the Minority in the discussion on the 2019 proposed budget considering that the Committee on Appropriations would begin its deliberations the next day.

He said that in the petition filed by Representative Baguilat Jr. and the so-called Magnificent Seven against the Speaker, Majority Leader, and Minority Leader in the First Regular Session, the Supreme Court categorically stated that Rep. Suarez' group was the validly constituted Minority and the Members in the Majority and Minority were defined under Rule II of the House Rules. He however pointed out that Minority Leader Suarez eventually left the Minority and joined the Majority.

Subsequently, Representative Fariñas held that the basis of the previous Monday's activities and proceedings were not found in the Rules and it was

because of this that he rose on the floor in the previous Wednesday session and asked about House Resolution No. 2025. He said that after the Body adopted the Resolution and ratified the illegal proceedings and there was no longer any question about Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo's legitimacy, he then signified that he was joining the Minority. He stressed that he and the Minority's status was clear and explained that the Minority had no business in electing the Speaker because they did not vote for the winning Speaker.

He pointed out that former Minority Leader Suarez led the ouster against the duly constituted Speaker and transferred from the Minority to the Majority and that the Majority were the 184 Members who were named in House Resolution No. 2025 as having voted for the new Speaker. He then asked how the Minority could now be included in the Majority if they were not even informed about any election during the regular session on July 23, 2018 during which the Body traditionally passed concurrent resolutions informing the Senate that the House was ready to hold a joint session to hear the State of the Nation Address (SONA) of the President.

Thereupon, he stressed that the Majority should not exercise its power and discretion to elect the Speaker with grave abuse of discretion; and that the House should follow its rules and should not allow the changing of the Speaker when it has already adjourned. Questioning the report that there were only 17 Members of the Minority as against his own count of 46, he stressed that the Minority wanted to help the administration of the new Speaker and that he wanted the 17th Congress to be successful in its last regular session as he had been the Majority Leader in the first two regular sessions. He said that although he could bring the matter to the Supreme Court, he wanted the Members to discuss the same and listen to reason.

At this point, Representative Fariñas read into the records Section 12 of the House Rules which states that the terms of office of the Speaker, Deputy Speakers, Sergeant-at-Arms, and Secretary General shall be from the time of their election until their resignation, removal, or permanent incapacitation. He pointed out that the Majority Leader and Minority Leaders have no terms of office as they are not officers. He clarified that he had served at the pleasure of the Majority and was not an officer; he was the Majority Leader until the ratification of House Resolution No. 2025 in the previous Wednesday; and he no longer considered himself as the Majority

Leader when he did not vote for Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo and he was not contesting the same.

He underscored that based on the House Rules, Representatives Suarez and Atienza and other Members had crossed their Rubicon and were already with the Majority when they participated in removing the former Speaker, but remarked that such a situation was embarrassing because the Minority did not have any business in ousting the Speaker.

He said that after the former Speaker was ousted and had accepted his fate, he applied with the Minority because he felt that the Majority did not want him anymore with them; and that he approached Deputy Minority Leader De Vera, number four in the Minority hierarchy, because Minority Leader Suarez, Senior Deputy Minority Leader Atienza, and Deputy Minority Leader Garbin had already joined the Majority.

He added that the selection of Speaker was limited to the Majority and the Minority is not at all involved therein; and that the Minority Leader could only be ousted by the members of the Minority. He pointed out that the Minority Leader and Majority Leader serve at the pleasure of their membership and that Representative De Vera was now the Minority Leader because Representative Suarez had abandoned his position. He added that those who abstained were now part of the Independents and had the option to be part of the Majority or Minority.

Thereupon, Representative Fariñas adverted to the case filed by Representatives Baguilat and Lagan about the election of Minority Leader Suarez on July 25, 2016. He said that the Supreme Court (1) decided that it could not in general look into the acts of Congress when there is allegation of grave abuse of discretion but (2) cited his reply as Majority Leader at the time to a question posed by Representative Atienza, that all those who vote for the winning Speaker shall belong to the Majority.

He opined that there will be a clear palpable grave abuse of discretion on the part of the leadership of the House to recognize Representative Suarez as Minority Leader because it would be an admission by the leadership that they conspired with the Minority to overthrow Speaker Alvarez and thereafter let them return as the Minority. He asked the Body not to taint the speakership of Representative Macapagal-Arroyo as he surmised that Representative Suarez was returning to the Minority because he was not given a position that he wanted.

Claiming that Representative De Vera was the new Minority Leader as there had been a vacancy in said position, he reminded his colleagues that the members of the Suarez group did not vote only once but twice for the winning Speaker. He warned that if the Minority will participate in the affairs of the Majority, the Majority can do the same with the Minority including the removal of the Minority Leader. He stressed anew that a real Minority has no business in declaring the seat of Speaker vacant and that the members of his group constituted the valid Minority because they did not vote for the Speaker.

Clarifying that he was appealing to the Body and he will raise a legal action if need be, Representative Fariñas questioned the argument that Representative Suarez' seat was not declared vacant as he stressed that the former Minority Leader had abandoned the same by going to the Majority and electing a new Speaker. He maintained that those who did not vote for Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo validly constituted the Minority under Minority Leader De Vera, and said that the latter was the one who accepted his written application to join the Minority.

Representative Fariñas likewise questioned the contention of the members of the Quimbo group that they constituted the real Minority, explaining that the Liberal Party would have been part of the Minority in the First Regular Session only if Representative Baguilat had succeeded as Minority Leader. Adverting to Deputy Speaker Quimbo's statement that it has never been a matter of numbers but of what is right, he stressed that what is right was that Representative De Vera was the current Minority Leader.

Representative Fariñas further questioned Deputy Speaker Quimbo's remark that he could not be part of the Minority because he was still part of PDP-LABAN, he stressed that the members of the Liberal Party had also joined the super majority in the First Regular Session and had even become Committee chairpersons.

Representative Fariñas said that the rule on the membership of the Majority and the Minority does not mention political parties and the members of the Majority are those who vote for the winning candidate while the members of the Minority are those who vote for the losing candidate. He reiterated that he did not want the Seventeenth Congress to fail considering that two-thirds of the Members were under him when he was the Majority Leader.

He then warned that the Liberal Party will take over every Committee membership if the Majority allows it to be the Minority; and if that would be the case, he will bring the matter to court. He however said that if he and his group would be recognized as the Minority, they will cooperate with the administration of President Rodrigo Roa Duterte and Speaker Macapagal-Arroyo, be productive, and craft better laws. He added that he wanted to retire after 39 years in public service, helping the institution to be the greatest of all Congresses.

He also appealed to the new leadership not to violate its own rules and said that he could not be blamed if he goes to another venue because he was not being afforded a speedy remedy in the Chamber. He asked the Body not to allow Representative Suarez to return as the Minority Leader as he had already crossed the line, saying he should comply with the application process if he wanted to return to the Minority. He also asked that the ratification of House Resolution No. 2025 shall be the last time that Congress will ever ratify something that was not done in accordance with its Rules. He then solicited a motion for the members of the Bicameral Conference Committee on the Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL), with the new Speaker and new Majority Leader, to file a resolution for the proper ratification of the Committee Report on the BOL.

In conclusion, he said that the office of Representative De Vera was clearly attacked and the latter was ousted without an opportunity to be heard and without due process. He added that the Majority cannot participate in the affairs of the Minority; the Minority has accepted Representative Fariñas and 13 of his colleagues; and expressed hope that the Body will recognize the real Minority in accordance with the House Rules and jurisprudence.

The Chair took note of the manifestation of Representative Fariñas.

REMARKS OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

Before the Body could proceed with the Business of the Day, Majority Leader Andaya mentioned the names of the following Members who would interpellate in the following session day: Reps. Raul A. Daza, Rodel M. Batocabe, Carlos Isagani T. Zarate, Tinio, Villarín, De Vera, Edgar R. Erice, Kaka J. Bag-ao, Jose Christopher Y. Belmonte, and Emmi A. De Jesus.

The Chair took note of the manifestation of Majority Leader Andaya.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE DAZA

Representative Daza stated for the record that he would like to avail of his right to take the floor, either to interpellate or make a counter-manifestation in regard to the statements of former Majority Leader Fariñas which he disagreed with.

The Chair said that Representative Daza may do so the following day.
