At this point, on motion of Representative Palma, the Chair recognized Rep. Alfredo A. Garbin Jr. to deliver his question of personal and collective privilege.

QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE OF REPRESENTATIVE GARBIN

Representative Garbin rose to give credit to the late Rep. Rodel Batocabe for his contributions in uplifting the lives of senior citizens, persons with disability, and other marginalized sectors as he shared about the latter's traits as a friend and colleague. He then commended the excellent police work of the Philippine National Police (PNP) headed by PNP Chief Oscar Albayalde, the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG), as well as the local Daraga Police, and the Provincial

Police Office for their swift action that led to the immediate capture of the perpetrators. Representative Garbin urged in the authorities to be relentless the murder case, expressed hope for the arrest of the alleged mastermind, the incumbent Mayor of Daraga, and joined the call to end private armed groups through the dismantling and confiscation of loose firearms.

REFERRAL OF THE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE GARBIN

There being no Member who wished to interpellate, on motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Garbin's speech to the Committee on Rules.

PRIVILEGE HOUR

It being a Monday, on successive motions of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body declared a Privilege Hour and the Chair thereafter recognized Rep. Leopoldo N. Bataoil for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BATAOIL

Initially stating that the precept “The law applies to all; otherwise, to none at all,” has come to the fore under contrasting and tragic circumstances through two noteworthy and well-publicized events, Representative Bataoil related the first incident involving the late Representative Batocabe whose murder, he alleged, was politically motivated on December 22, 2018 in Daraga, Albay.

Representative Bataoil then commended the superb teamwork of the PNP Special Investigation Task Force-Batocabe, the CIDG, and Police Regional Office 5 for successfully solving the case. He also expressed his admiration to the non-officers of the PNP, the Bureau of Fire Protection, the Bureau of Jail Management and Penology, and some of the officers of the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) who were present in the Session Hall, for risking their lives to save and protect other people.

Representative Bataoil likewise said that he took the floor on behalf of Police Officer (PO) 3 Federico Macaya Jr. who was subjected to assault, disrespect and abuse by the Mayor of Guimbal, Iloilo; noted that the incident must not be allowed to pass without justice, and said that the police officer should be provided with appropriate legal assistance in pursuing his criminal complaint and in defending himself against possible counter-charges.

After informing the Body that in a few months' time his term as a Member of the House of Representatives will come to an end, Representative Bataoil underscored that he has added his nine years of service in the House to his more than 30 years of dedicated service to the country and the people as a man in uniform. He then thanked and expressed his honor for having served the PNP and the people of his district in Pangasinan, as well as for having served the country together with his colleagues.

On motion of Representative Palma, the Chair recognized Rep. Gary C. Alejano for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ALEJANO

At the outset, Representative Alejano expressed his appreciation to the AFP and the PNP for their service to the country. He then acknowledged the role and importance of the PNP and added that he and other Members such as Representatives Bataoil, Romeo M. Acop, and Amado T. Espino Jr. have worked on numerous measures seeking to preserve the PNP's integrity and to improve its efficiency in performing its functions as protector of public safety and the rule of law.

He then discussed with Representative Bataoil the status of House Bill No. 8628 which he and Representative Bataoil principally authored, seeking to transfer the Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA) and the National Police Training Institute (NPTI) from the Philippine Public Safety College (PPSC) to the PNP; the need to revisit in order to amend Republic Act (R.A.) No. 8551 specifically on the provision granting police powers to local chief executives by making the PNP answerable to government officials rather than strengthening its independence; the issue that some local government officials are supporting the New People's Army (NPA) and even paying revolutionary taxes and granting permit to campaign; and the review of the Local Government Code of 1991, R.A. No. 6975, and R.A. No. 8551, all with the end in view of bringing awareness to all government agencies of their responsibilities in ensuring the overall security of the country with the concerted efforts as well of local government officials, nongovernment organizations, and the entire citizenry.

Representative Alejano then shifted his interpellation on the transfer of internal security operations particularly the handling of the insurgency problem from the PNP to the AFP which, he opined, should be given back to the former as the armed

forces have, for the longest time, neglected the external defense operations, citing specifically the protection and security of the country's coastline which, he claimed, has led to the intrusion and usurpation by China.

Thereupon, Representative Bataoil agreed to support any measure that would finally assist the PNP in expediting its shift as the primary unit responsible for the internal security operations so that the AFP would be able to focus on the external defense.

The two Members thereafter focused on the inadequacies of R.A. No. 8551 and how an amendment would strengthen the internal discipline in the PNP, the possibility of the agency being an independent body, and the transfer from the PPSC to the PNP of the comprehensive education and training programs of the PNPA.

SUSPENSION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body approved to suspend the Privilege Hour.

Thereafter, on successive motions of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body approved Journals No. 40 and 41 dated December 11 and 12, 2018, respectively, considering that copies thereof had been distributed to the Members.

RATIFICATION OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORTS

On successive motions of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body considered and subsequently ratified the following Conference Committee Reports on the disagreeing provisions of the House and Senate Bills hereunder indicated:

1. House Bill No. 8637 and Senate Bill No. 1997, creating the Regional and Investment Infrastructure Coordinating Hub of Central Luzon;

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

At this juncture, Rep. Jose L. Atienza Jr. pointed out that he was not questioning the quorum and that there were enough Members on the floor. He however manifested for the record that there were only 162 Members present in the Session Hall and not 206 Members as announced by the Secretariat. He underscored that the Roll Call was not accurately recorded.

The Chair took note of his manifestation.

RATIFICATION OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE REPORTS

(Continuation)

2. House Bill No. 8417 and Senate Bill No. 1439, establishing the Energy Virtual One-Stop Shop for the purpose of streamlining the permitting process of power generation, transmission, and distribution projects; and

- House Bill No. 8419 and Senate Bill No. 1397, preventing and penalizing the use of motorcycles in the commission of crimes by requiring bigger, readable, and color-coded number plates and identification marks.

DESIGNATION OF HOUSE CONFEREES

On successive motions of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body designated the following Members to the Conference Committees to reconcile the disagreeing provisions of the following House Bills and their Senate counterparts:

- House Bill No. 7376 and Senate Bill No. 1823, further strengthening the Office of the Solicitor General by increasing its powers and functions: Reps. Doy C. Leachon, Vicente “Ching” S.E. Veloso, Henry S. Oaminal, Strike B. Revilla, Ron P. Salo, Joaquin M. Chipeco Jr., and Anthony M. Bravo, PhD; and
- House Bill No. 8629 and Senate Bill No. 1531, institutionalizing an Energy Efficiency and Conservation Program: Reps. Lord Allan Jay Q. Velasco, Carlos Roman L. Uybarreta; Jose Enrique “Joet” S. Garcia III, Mark Aeron H. Sambar, Reynaldo V. Umali, and Orestes T. Salon.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Whereupon, Representative Palma acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Representative Bataoil.

RESUMPTION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body resumed the Privilege Hour, and the Chair recognized Representative Bataoil anew to respond to the interpellation of Rep. Romeo M. Acop.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ACOP

Representative Acop’s interpellation focused on the dignity that the State should have given to PO3 Macaya of Guimbal Police Station in Iloilo. He thereafter inquired on Representative Bataoil’s concept of “abuse of authority” and “oppression,” as they discussed whether 1) there was an abuse of authority and oppression that happened on December 26, 2018 in Guimbal, Iloilo; 2) the PNP was at fault and whether the concerned PNP personnel deserved the treatment he received; and 3) the act of

assaulting a man in uniform would constitute failure of public officials to observe the standards of professional conduct.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE BATAOIL

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Bataoil’s privilege speech and the interpellations thereon, to the Committee on Ethics and Privileges.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Palma, the Chair recognized Representative Atienza for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

In his speech, Representative Atienza expressed concern over the insulting statements hurled by President Rodrigo Roa Duterte against the servants of God and the Roman Catholic Church to the point of even cursing God and calling Him names which he said was not appropriate for a leader like President Duterte. Even as he continues to support the agenda of the President and his efforts to give Filipinos a better life, Representative Atienza however stressed that the Chief Executive’s insulting statements against the Catholic faith have created a climate of fear and a culture of death. He emphasized that God founded the Church and it cannot be destroyed and warned that the President would not succeed if he keeps on picking on the Catholic Church.

As his loyalty remains with the President, he stated that he however has to correct the wrongdoings of the President and enjoined the latter to concentrate on giving a better life, economy, and peace and order to the Filipinos instead of ordering the killing of priests and bishops. He also enjoined his colleagues to register their collective voice and not to tolerate this kind of government attitude especially coming from the President himself and not to support the continuing destruction of the Catholic Church. He stressed that he believes in his faith and will continue to defend the same no matter what happens.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Thereupon, on motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Atienza to the Committee on Rules.

SUSPENSION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

At this juncture, on motion Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body suspended the Privilege Hour.

Upon Representative Palma's further motion, the Chair recognized Majority Leader Rolando G. Andaya Jr. on a question of personal and collective privilege.

QUESTION OF PRIVILEGE OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

Stating that the House is doing its best to approve all the administrative measures endorsed by the President, Majority Leader Andaya however raised the following issues pertaining to the proposed 2019 General Appropriations Act (GAA) which Department of Budget and Management (DBM) Secretary Benjamin Diokno has failed to include in the 2019 national budget measure that his office submitted to Congress: 1) the ₱1 billion appropriation needed for the holding of the Bangsamoro Organic Law (BOL) plebiscite on February 6, 2019; 2) the ₱40 billion initial funding for the implementation of the BOL, if and when it would be approved; and 3) the cash-based budgeting system which is already off tangent considering that the government is operating on a reenacted budget and its debt to various contractors and suppliers which already reached ₱100 billion in 2018 would only be paid in the first quarter of 2019.

Majority Leader Andaya signified his wish for the Body to further investigate the foregoing issues.

REFERRAL OF THE SPEECH OF MAJORITY LEADER ANDAYA

In view thereof, on motion of Majority Leader Andaya, there being no objection, the Body referred the former's speech to the Committee on Appropriations for its appropriate action.

RESUMPTION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

Thereafter, on successive motions of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body resumed the Privilege Hour and extended it for another 15 minutes.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

At this point, Representative Palma acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of the guests of Rep. Romero "Miro" S. Quimbo.

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Palma, the Chair recognized Rep. Tom S. Villarín for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN

Representative Villarín talked about the effects of the bankruptcy of Hanjin Heavy Industries and Construction Philippines on local banks, the displaced workers, and the local economy. He also expressed concern over the possible takeover of the Hanjin shipyard located in the Subic port by Chinese shipbuilding companies at a time when the country is dealing with Chinese incursions in the West Philippine Sea which, he said, may leave the country defenseless and highly vulnerable.

Representative Villarín then discussed how the Hanjin default and the shipbuilding industry could be used as a major national industrial policy link to protect national security and to avail of the country's comparative advantage in the Asia-Pacific region. He said that the sector has a readily available and easily trainable technical and skilled manpower for shipbuilding and ship repair works and that it could jumpstart industrialization and job creation and other significant benefits to maritime transport and shipping sector.

He then called on the government to 1) ensure full compensation and post-employment benefits for affected Hanjin employees; 2) prioritize national security in shaping the future of Hanjin's properties in the Subic port; and 3) examine the possibility of considering shipbuilding as a cornerstone industrial policy.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE VILLARIN

On motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Villarín's privilege speech to the appropriate committee.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ZARATE

Recognized by the Chair on Representative Palma's motion, Rep. Carlos Isagani T. Zarate explained the negative impact of the delayed enactment into law of the 2019 General Appropriations Bill (GAB) especially on ordinary government workers and employees. He criticized the government for its lack of political will to alleviate the suffering of government workers by increasing their salaries and wages, as well as its plan to hire an independent firm to study and formulate a salary structure for government employees. He added that the government should instead use the said amount to fund such salary increases and wages.

Representative Zarate thereafter urged his colleagues to take a stand to stop contractualization, thwart the repression of the workers' rights to unionism and activism, and help create a national minimum wage system for all government workers.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ZARATE

There being no Member who wished to interpellate, on motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Zarate to the appropriate committee.

EXTENSION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

On successive motions of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body extended the Privilege Hour for another five minutes and thereafter, the Chair recognized Rep. Sarah Jane I. Elago to deliver her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ELAGO

Representative Elago talked about the task and prospects of the Filipino youth for the year 2019 in terms of instituting free public education at all levels, stopping tuition fee increases, junking all other school fees, allotting bigger funding for education, scrapping unsound policies that lead to the spiralling costs of education, and reorienting the education system towards being nationalist rather than as a money-making scheme.

She also expounded on other issues in connection with providing decent jobs for the youth and the people; implementing a concrete national industrialization program and a genuine agrarian reform; granting just and lasting peace; improving health care and social services; providing better Internet in the country; and upholding national and economic sovereignty, among others.

Considering that the 2019 GAB has not yet been approved, Representative Elago challenged the Senate to introduce a significant increase in the budget of the state universities and colleges instead of making a huge cut thereon to allow the youth better access to education. She also advocated the upholding of the principles of human rights, peace and justice on Youth and Solidarity Day on February 7, 2019. As 2019 ushers in, she enjoined everyone to

preserve unity in facing challenges together with all Filipinos as it is the source of strength and hope of the youth towards victory.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE ELAGO

There being no interpellators, on motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Elago to the appropriate committee.

On further motion of Representative Palma, the Chair recognized Rep. France L. Castro for her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CASTRO (F.L.)

Representative Castro spoke about the memorandum issued by the PNP units nationwide regarding the inventory of all public and private school teachers who are members of or aligned with the Alliance of Concerned Teachers (ACT). She said that the profiling of ACT leader-teachers and members is a "scare tactic" of the present Administration against a legitimate organization which aims to push for the rights of the education sector. She then cited its functions and track record in fighting for the rights and the welfare of public school teachers.

She pointed out that said profiling is a violation of the ACT members' privacy, freedom of expression, and right to self-organization and assembly. She said that they have the right to due process and not by the "tokhang" style *modus operandi*. She then signified her unity with the ACT in upholding the rights of its members as they continue to fight for a better future for teachers, students, and the people.

REFERRAL OF THE PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CASTRO (F.L.)

There being no Member who wished to interpellate, on motion of Representative Palma, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Representative Castro to the appropriate Committee.
