THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Chair declared the Privilege Hour, and thereafter recognized Rep. Bernadette "BH" Herrera-Dy to deliver her privilege speech.

MANIFESTATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ATIENZA

Before Representative Herrera-Dy could deliver her speech, the Chair recognized Rep. Jose L. Atienza Jr. who stated that Journal No. 43, dated December 4, 2017, failed to substantially talk about the heroism and sacrifices of former Senator Benigno "Ninoy" S. Aquino Jr. which was the focus of the speech that he delivered the previous day. He urged the Secretariat to correct the matter and to faithfully write down in the Journal the purpose of his message, which is to remind the nation not to forget the former Senator's sacrifices in order to attain the democracy that the Filipinos are now enjoying.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE HERRERA-DY

Recognized by the Chair, Representative Herrera-Dy called on her colleagues to use their oversight powers to safeguard the rights of Filipino children. In line with the country's commitment to the observance of the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child, she underscored laws that have been enacted in Congress to address political, socio-cultural, and economic challenges that affect the lives of children. However, she noted that despite said measures, the lives of children have remained threatened and subject to violence, discrimination, and abuse.

She then referred in particular to Republic Acts (R.A.s) No. 7610, 9208, 10364, 9262, 9775, and 9344, as amended by R.A. No. 10630 whose implementation has posed a great challenge to officials in both the national and local levels. She discussed the

findings and recommendations of a study made by the Philippine Legislators' Committee on Population and Development thereon. Subsequently, she recommended the conduct of a House inquiry on the implementation of the aforestated laws.

REFERRAL OF REPRESENTATIVE HERRERA-DY'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Herrera-Dy's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

On further motion of Representative Nograles, the Chair recognized Rep. Frances L. Castro to deliver her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CASTRO (F.L.)

Adverting to the country's celebration of International Human Rights Day on December 10, Representative Castro spoke about what she called the increasing fascism of the current administration. Speaking in Filipino, she said that despite numerous resolutions sponsored and privilege speeches made by the Makabayan bloc Representatives, no concrete action has been made by Congress to give justice to the victims of human rights abuse. She cited facts and figures on the nationwide incidence of bombings of lumad schools, human rights violations in pursuit of the war against illegal drugs, militarization, crackdown on activists, extrajudicial killings, and arrests of militant leaders including leaders of drivers groups.

She added that the Administration's anti-poor policies such as the tax reform program, inhumane wages, contractualization, and the absence of genuine land reform are also gradually killing the citizens of the country.

Representative Castro subsequently stressed that despite the current situation, the Makabayan bloc and progressive mass organizations will stand their ground to defend the rights of every Filipino.

REFERRAL OF REPRESENTATIVE CASTRO'S (F.L.) PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Castro's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Thereafter, Representative Nograles (J.J.) acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Reps. Cheryl P. Deloso-Montalla, Francisco G. Datol Jr., Milagros Aquino-Magsaysay, Joseph Sto. Niño B. Bernos, and Michael L. Romero, Ph.D.

On further motion of Representative Nograles, the Chair recognized Rep. Ariel "Ka Ayik" B. Casilao for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE CASILAO

Representative Casilao condemned the recent arrest of Mr. George San Mateo, the leader of the Pinag-Isang Samahan Ng Tsuper at Operators Nationwide (PISTON), for leading a recent transport strike. Speaking in Filipino, he also mentioned President Rodrigo Roa Duterte's issuance of a proclamation declaring the Communist Party of the Philippines (CPP) and New People's Army (NPA) as terrorists; and his pronouncements that legitimate mass organizations who were critical of his policies, were fronts of the CPP-NPA. He assailed the suppression of the right of the people to air grievances against government policies and stressed that political killings and forceful arrests are against the rights of every human being. He pointed out that more illegal arrests, enforced disappearances, and political killings will occur.

Representative Casilao then said that the Anakpawis Party-List, Makabayan, Bagong Alyansang Makabayan, and Karapatan will commemorate the forthcoming International Human Rights Day through a big protest march. He concluded that in the face of tyranny, defiance and resistance is the only way.

REFERRAL OF REPRESENTATIVE CASILAO'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH

Upon Representative Nograles' (J.J.) motion, there being no objection, the Body referred Representative Casilao's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules for its appropriate action.

TERMINATION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

At this juncture, on motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.

BUSINESS FOR THE DAY: COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 454 ON HOUSE BILL NO. 6604

On successive motions of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 6604, as embodied in Committee Report No. 454 and reported out by the Committee on Suffrage and Electoral Reforms, regulating the rates of political propaganda on television, radio and print during an electoral campaign period, amending for the purpose Section 11 of R.A. No. 9006 or the "Fair Election Act"; dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; as concurred by Rep. Sherwin N. Tugna, Chairperson of the Committee on Suffrage and Electoral Reforms, adopted the Explanatory Note thereof as the sponsorship remarks on the measure; terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; terminated the period of amendments in the absence of Committee and individual amendments; and approved the same on Second Reading through viva voce voting.

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

The session was suspended at 5:00 p.m., upon motion of Representative Nograles (J.J).

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

At 5:00 p.m., the session resumed.

BUSINESS FOR THE DAY: COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 487 ON HOUSE BILL NO. 6702

Thereupon, on successive motions of Representative Nograles (J.J), there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 6702, as embodied in Committee Report No. 487 and reported out by the Committees on Welfare of Children, and Appropriations, regulating the importation, manufacture, distribution and sale of children's products containing hazardous chemicals and providing penalties for violation thereof; dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; as concurred by Rep. Divina Grace C. Yu, Chairperson of the Committee on Welfare of Children, adopted the Explanatory Note as the sponsorship remarks on the measure; terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; terminated the period of amendments in the absence of Committee or individual amendments; and approved the same on Second Reading through viva voce voting.

BUSINESS FOR THE DAY: COMMITTEE REPORT NO. 482 ON HOUSE BILL NO. 6686

Upon motion of Representative Nograles (J.J)., there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading House Bill No. 6686, as embodied in Committee Report No. 482 and reported out by the Committees on Agrarian Reform, and Appropriations.

Upon the direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

"AN ACT GRANTING FULL INSURANCE COVERAGE TO ALL QUALIFIED AGRARIAN REFORM BENEFICIARIES OF THE COMPREHENSIVE AGRARIAN REFORM PROGRAM, AMENDING FOR THE PURPOSE SECTION 14 OF REPUBLIC ACT NO. 9700, OTHERWISE KNOWN AS THE 'COMPREHENSIVE AGRARIAN REFORM PROGRAM EXTENSION WITH REFORMS'."

As copies of the Bill had been distributed to the Members, on motion of Representative Nograles, there being no objection, the Body dispensed with the reading of the text of the measure without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House.

Subsequently, on motion of Representative Nograles, the Chair recognized the Chairperson of the Committee on Agrarian Reform, Rep. Rene L. Relampagos for his sponsorship speech.

SPONSORSHIP SPEECH OF REPRESENTATIVE RELAMPAGOS

Representative Relampagos initially thanked the House leadership and the authors of House Bill No. 6686 for supporting the policy of providing immediate financial protection, assistance, and relief from losses to affected agrarian reform beneficiaries (ARBs). He explained that the Bill will protect ARBs from extreme financial losses due to unfortunate events; ensure the delivery of support services from the Department of Agrarian Reform, Department of Agriculture, and the Philippine Crop Insurance Corporation; serve as a credit reduction mechanism and facilitate credit access to formal lending institutions; provide a choice of insurance windows to address various issues impeding availment of insurance in agriculture; and enable the government to support ARBs through a risk-free management mechanism.

As Representative Relampagos stressed the constitutional mandate of Congress to legislate laws that would respond to the needs of the Filipino people especially the landless farmers and farmworkers, he then asked for support in immediately passing the Bill.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE LAGMAN

Recognized by the Chair upon motion of Representative Nograles' (J.J.), Rep. Edcel C. Lagman manifested his support for House Bill No. 6686 and then discussed with Representative Relampagos the initial annual appropriation for the payment of insurance premiums of all qualified ARBs in the country.

Considering that there will be deficiency in funds to cover all of the ARBs, Representative Lagman inquired as to who would prioritize and what would be the mode of prioritization among the qualified beneficiaries.

SUSPENSION OF CONSIDERATION ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 6686

At this point, on motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body suspended the consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 6686 to allow the Committee on Agrarian Reform to collate the information being requested by Representative Lagman.

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF CERTAIN BILLS UNDER THE BUSINESS FOR THE DAY

On successive motions of Representative Nograles (J.J), there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading the following House Bills calendared under the Business for the Day, as contained in various Committee Reports and submitted by the Committees concerned; dispensed with the reading of the texts of the measures without prejudice to their insertion into the Record of the House; adopted the Explanatory Notes as the sponsorship remarks on the measures; terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; approved the amendments as contained in the Committee Report;

terminated the period of amendments; and approved the same on Second Reading through *viva voce* voting:

- 1. House Bill No. Bill No. 6714 as embodied in Committee Report No. 492 and submitted by the Committees on Civil Service and Professional Regulation, and Appropriations, regulating the practice of food technology in the Philippines, and creating the Board of Food Technology; and
- 2. House Bill No. 3222, as embodied in Committee Report No. 494 and submitted by the Committees on Basic Education and Culture, Appropriations, and Ways and Means, establishing a national vision screening program for kindergarten pupils.

ADDITIONAL COAUTHORS

Thereafter, on motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body approved to include as additional coauthors to House Bills No. 6604, and 6649, and House Resolution No. 1421, as contained in the lists to be submitted by the Committee on Rules.

ADOPTION OF HOUSE RESOLUTION NO. 1421

On successive motions of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body considered House Resolution No. 1421, urging the Department of Tourism (DOT) to institutionalize and promote the Kalapati Festival of Barangay Holy Spirit in Quezon City; dispensed with the reading of the text thereof without prejudice to its insertion into the Record of the House; and unanimously adopted the same.

OMNIBUS APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF CERTAIN HOUSE BILLS UNDER THE BUSINESS FOR THURSDAY AND FRIDAY

On an omnibus motion of Representative Nograles (J.J.), there being no objection, the Body considered on Second Reading the following House Bills calendared under the Business for Thursday and Friday, as contained in various Committee Reports and submitted by the Committees hereunder indicated; dispensed with the reading of the texts thereof without prejudice to their insertion into the Record of the House; adopted the Explanatory Notes as the sponsorship remarks on the measures; terminated the period of sponsorship and debate; approved the Committee amendments, as contained

in their respective Committee Reports, if any; terminated the period of amendments; and approved the same on Second Reading through *viva voce* voting:

- 1. House Bill No. 6585, as contained in Committee Report No. 442, and submitted by the Committees on Tourism; and Appropriations, declaring Barangay Tala in Orani, Bataan an ecotourism zone;
- 2. House Bill No. 6602, as contained in Committee Report No. 452, and submitted by the Committees on Basic Education and Culture, and Appropriations, separating the Heracleo Casco National High School Annex in Barangay San Isidro, Sta. Maria, Davao Occidental and converting it to the Pedro Mariscal National High School;
- 3. House Bill No. 6603, as contained in Committee Report No. 453, and submitted by the Committees on Basic Education and Culture, and Appropriations, separating the Kalbay National High School Annex in Barangay Sugal, Jose Abad Santos, Davao Occidental and converting it to Emeliano S. Fontanares Sr. National High School;
- 4. House Bill No. 6681, as contained in Committee Report No. 478, and submitted by the Committees on Tourism, and Appropriations, declaring the Porta Vega Beach and the shorelines of Barangays T.R. Yangco, Cadulan, and Divisoria, all in Dimasalang, Masbate, an ecotourism site, establishing the Porta Vega Ecotourism Council;
- 5. House Bill No. 6682, as contained in Committee Report No. 479, and submitted by the Committees on Tourism, and Appropriations, declaring the Limahong Channel in Lingayen, Pangasinan a tourist spot;
- House Bill No. 6683, as contained in Committee Report No. 480, and submitted by the Committees on Tourism, and Appropriations, declaring La Union province a tourist destination and the "surfing capital of the North", and providing for its development;
- 7. House Bill No. 6711, as contained in Committee Report No. 491, and submitted by the Committees on Health, and Appropriations, upgrading the Dr. Paulino J. Garcia Memorial Research and Medical Center Extension Hospital in Talavera, Nueva

Ecija, to a level-2 hospital and increasing its bed capacity to one hundred (100) beds to be now known as the Talavera General Hospital;

- 8. House Bill No. 6715, as contained in Committee Report No. 493, and submitted by the Committees on Higher and Technical Education, Appropriations, and Ways and Means, separating the Southern Philippines Agriculture, Business, Marine and Aquatic School of Technology (SPAMAST) Digos City Campus in Digos, Davao del Sur, from the SPAMAST in Malita, Davao Occidental and converting it into the Davao del Sur State College;
- 9. House Bill No. 6740, as contained in Committee Report No. 496, and submitted by the Committees on Health, and Appropriations, upgrading the Labuan Public Hospital in Zamboanga City into a Level II Hospital to be known as the Labuan General Hospital, increasing its bed capacity for general care services to one hundred (100);
- 10. House Bill No. 6741, as contained in Committee Report No. 497, and submitted by the Committees on Higher and Technical Education, Appropriations, and Ways and Means, converting the Zamboanga City State Polytechnic College into the Zamboanga Peninsula Polytechnic State University; and
- 11. House Bill No. 6742, as contained in Committee Report No. 498, and submitted by the Committees on Health, and Appropriations, increasing the bed capacity of the Zamboanga City Medical Center from five hundred (500) to eight hundred (800) beds amending Republic Act No. 7272.
