On motion of Representative Noel, there being no objection, the Body resumed the consideration on Second Reading of House Bill No. 8869 contained in Committee Report No. 1076 as reported out by the Committee on Energy.

Upon direction of the Chair, the Secretary General read the title of the Bill, to wit:

“AN ACT ALLOCATING THE NET NATIONAL GOVERNMENT SHARE FROM THE MALAMPAYA NATURAL GAS PROJECT FOR THE PAYMENT OF THE STRANDED DEBTS AND STRANDED CONTRACT COSTS OF THE NATIONAL POWER CORPORATION AND TO FINANCE FURTHER EXPLORATION, DEVELOPMENT AND EXPLOITATION OF ENERGY RESOURCES TO LOWER ELECTRICITY RATES.”

On motion of Representative Noel, the Chair recognized Rep. Lord Allan Jay Q. Velasco, Chairperson of the sponsoring Committee, to sponsor the measure.

Representative Noel stated that the parliamentary status was that the Bill was in the period of sponsorship and debate; and upon her motion, the Chair recognized Rep. Carlos Isagani T. Zarate for his interpellation.

INTERPELLATION OF REPRESENTATIVE ZARATE

Representative Zarate initially asked whether the proposed measure is in line with the thrust of Republic Act (R.A.) No. 9136 or the Electric Power Industry Reform Act of 2001 (EPIRA). He recalled that the latter was enacted to enable the government to sell its power assets under the National Power Corporation (NPC), as transferring its management to the private sector would make it more efficient as well as generate funds to pay off NPC debts. He also stated that one of the provisions in the EPIRA was to sell off state power assets to pay for the debts

of the NPC; as such, the Power Sector Assets and Liabilities Management (PSALM) Corporation was established.

He and the Sponsor then exchanged views on the following issues, among others: (1) the huge amount of NPC debts and its total assets as governed by the PSALM Corp. after payment of its debts amounting to ₱830 billion; (2) the number of power assets already privatized and how many were left; (3) the financial status and utilization of the Malampaya Fund; and (4) the ₱25 billion share intended for the PNOC Exploration Corporation.

Representative Zarate thereafter called attention to the fact that the subsidies being given to the NPC are bigger than the amount allocated to non-NPC areas, and discussed with Representative Velasco the full payment of the NPC debt of ₱123 billion by 2022. The Sponsor assured that by then, the cost of electricity would have gone down because the loan payment would result in lower universal charges.

Subsequently, Representative Velasco committed to give Representative Zarate the data on universal charges and the list of creditors who would be paid off using the Malampaya Fund. He then suggested that Representative Zarate file a resolution to enable the Committee on Energy to address his concern on PSALM's inefficiency in managing the NPC assets.

In ending his interpellation, Representative Zarate stressed that the House should use its oversight powers to ensure the proper use of the Malampaya Fund in fulfilling the financial obligations of the NPC.

APPROVAL ON SECOND READING OF HOUSE BILL NO. 8869
