TO THE COMMITTEE ON RULES

SUSPENSION OF SESSION

On motion of Rep. Victoria Isabel G. Noel, the Chair suspended the session at 4:06 p.m.

RESUMPTION OF SESSION

The session resumed at 4:08 p.m.

PRIVILEGE HOUR

The day being a Monday, on motion of Rep. Francisco Jose F. Matugas II, there being no objection, the Chair declared a Privilege Hour and thereafter recognized Rep. Jose Antonio “Kuya Jonathan” R. Sy-Alvarado for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. SY-ALVARADO

Speaking in Filipino, Rep. Sy-Alvarado rose to trace and commemorate the establishment of the First Republic of the Philippines and proclamation of the Malolos Constitution on January 23, 1899. He stressed that it was a culmination of the Filipinos' forbearance, rebellion, and patriotism during 300 years of Spanish colonialism. He however said that the Republic did not last long because the country was eventually colonized by the United States.

Rep. Sy-Alvarado then lamented the fact that the country had been celebrating other historical dates but not what happened on January 23, 1899 which, he stressed, was an independent act made without any external assistance or influence and was a trophy and reward for the country's long, winding, and bloody journey towards destiny. He urged the Members to pass House Bill No. 447 commemorating the birth of the first republic not only in the Philippines but also in Asia and Africa on January 23, 1899, to inculcate in the minds of Filipinos their highest and greatest accomplishment as a people.

REFERRAL OF REP. SY-ALVARADO'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Matugas, there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. Sy-Alvarado's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules.

ACKNOWLEDGMENT OF GUESTS

Rep. Matugas then acknowledged the presence in the Session Hall of guests of Rep. Sy-Alvarado.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Matugas, the Chair recognized Rep. Aurelio “Dong” D. Gonzales Jr. for his privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. GONZALES (A.D.)

Rep. Gonzales analyzed delays in solicited and unsolicited public-private partnership (PPP) projects involving various expressways, connector roads, and

school infrastructure throughout the country, whose titles he cited and whose status he described. He first pointed out that the projects will remedy traffic crisis and congestion, improve the international and domestic investment environment, reduce travel time, mitigate flooding and integrate flood control systems, and propel economic growth. He then stressed the need to address the following problems: slow acquisition of right-of-way and release of crucial certificates or permits; Republic Act (RA) No. 10752's stringent requirements; lack of project assessors, lawyers, and engineers among government agencies concerned; and delayed project evaluation.

INTERPELLATION OF REP. MARCOLETA

Recognized by the Chair, Rep. Rodante D. Marcoleta initially inquired on the strict requirements on right-of-way acquisition under RA No. 10752. Rep. Gonzales (A.D.) said that he had already filed a bill to amend the same because its implementing rules and regulations which had been signed into law by former President Benigno Aquino, had not yet been implemented.

Thereupon, Rep. Marcoleta stressed the need for a balance between facilitating projects and complying with the minimum requirements of the law; while Rep. Gonzales reiterated the administrative, legal, and technical factors which delayed the completion of PPP projects.

REFERRAL OF REP. GONZALES' (A.D.) PRIVILEGE SPEECH

On motion of Rep. Matugas, there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Gonzales, including Rep. Marcoleta's interpellation, to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Matugas, the Chair recognized Rep. Shernee Abubakar Tan for her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. TAN (S.)

Rep. Tan said that she took the floor because of the despair and poverty suffered by the people in the Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (ARMM). She cited facts and figures on the increase in massive fund allocations for the region during the administrations of Presidents Benigno S. Aquino III and Rodrigo Roa Duterte, but asked why the ARMM remained the poorest region in the country and the poverty incidence therein was rising. She also asked where the ARMM's billions of funds went to, and pointed out

that she had raised similar issues during the 2017 national budget hearings. She stressed that despite her persistent requests, ARMM officials did not submit documents to refute or comply with Commission on Audit reports on unliquidated cash advances, anomalous purchases, questionable procurements, and unaccounted allotments.

After asking several ARMM Congressmen to explain why they had pleaded with Senator Panfilo "Ping" Lacson not to slash their current allocations, Rep. Tan called on Congress to lift up the ARMM people. She requested an investigation to ferret out the truth, right the wrong beneath the facts, give redress to the grievances of the grossly assailed, and stop the bleeding of government coffers.

REFERRAL OF REP. TAN'S (S.) PRIVILEGE SPEECH

Thereupon, on motion of Rep. Salvador B. Belaro Jr., there being no objection, the Body referred the privilege speech of Rep. Tan to the Committee on Rules.

SUSPENSION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion of Rep. Belaro, there being no objection, the Body suspended the Privilege Hour.

APPROVAL OF THE JOURNAL

On motion of Rep. Gonzales (A.P.), there being no objection, the Body approved Journal No. 59, dated January 18, 2017.

**RESUMPTION AND EXTENSION
OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR**

On successive motions of Rep. Gonzales (A.P.), there being no objection, the Body resumed and thereafter extended the Privilege Hour.

On further motion of Rep. Gonzales, the Chair recognized Rep. Sitti Djalila A. Turabin-Hataman to deliver her privilege speech.

**PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF
REP. TURABIN-HATAMAN**

Rep. Turabin-Hataman expressed disheartenment over the presentation of Yakan tennum or Yakan weave as a fabric from Region IX instead of the ARMM, in a pre-pageant event of the 2017 Miss Universe contest in the Philippines. Speaking as a daughter of the province of Basilan in the ARMM, she explained that Yakan tennum was not just a product but a traditional art of weaving among Muslim ethnic groups; it represented their identity; and its colors, patterns, and techniques remained the same for the past 300 years. She clarified that Muslims supported the use and promotion of traditional arts, but appealed for the rightful attribution of the origin of the same. She also opined that it was unfair to attribute only negative things but not beautiful things, to their region. Saying so much had already been taken away from them, she called on everyone to ensure that nothing more was taken away because no people and community must be denied their rightful heritage.

**REFERRAL OF REP. TURABIN-
HATAMAN'S PRIVILEGE SPEECH**

On motion of Rep. Belaro, there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. Turabin-Hataman's privilege speech to the Committee on Rules.

Thereafter, on motion of Rep. Belaro, the Chair recognized Rep. Sarah Jane I. Elago to deliver her privilege speech.

PRIVILEGE SPEECH OF REP. ELAGO

Rep. Elago focused on the Armed Forces of the Philippines's recent military offensive in North Cotabato which she called a violation of the unilateral ceasefire agreement. She then discussed the Duterte Administration's (1) failure to release political prisoners despite its commitment thereon under the Joint

Agreement on Safety and Immunity Guarantees (JASIG) and Comprehensive Agreement on Respect for Human Rights and International Humanitarian Law (CARHRIHL); and (2) insistence on a bilateral ceasefire agreement which had led to the breakdown of past peace negotiations. She called on the President to comply with the CARHRIHL and JASIG and sign the supplemental guidelines to implement the latter.

Rep. Elago also talked about resolving the root cause of poverty, stressing that peace negotiations were not just about ending hostilities. She said in this regard that the Philippine government and National Democratic Front will discuss the Comprehensive Agreement on Social and Economic Reforms in the ongoing third round of peace talks in Italy, which will tackle various socio-economic issues including access to and quality of education.

REFERRAL OF REP. ELAGO'S SPEECH

Thereupon, on motion of Rep. Belaro, there being no objection, the Body referred Rep. Elago's speech to the Committee on Rules.

TERMINATION OF THE PRIVILEGE HOUR

On motion on Rep. Belaro, there being no objection, the Body terminated the Privilege Hour.

**RECONSIDERATION OF THE
REFERRAL OF CERTAIN MEASURES**

On motion of Rep. Belaro, there being no objection, the Body reconsidered the referral of House Resolutions No. 680 and 681 to the Committee on Human Rights and subsequently referred the same to the Committee on Rules.
