AN ACT
ESTABLISHING AN INTEGRATED SCHOOL IN BARANGAY BAGBAG,
QUEZON CITY, METRO MANILA TO BE KNOWN AS BAGBAG INTEGRATED
SCHOOL AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

EXPLANATORY NOTE

The State puts a premium on promoting the important role of the youth in nation-building as well as the role of quality and accessible education for national development.

Article XIV, Section 1, of the Philippine Constitution provides that "the State shall protect and promote the right of all citizens to quality education at all levels, and shall take appropriate steps to make such education accessible to all."

There exists a clamor for the establishment of an integrated school in Barangay Bagbag, in the Fifth Legislative District of Quezon City to be known as Bagbag Integrated School. In order to achieve the desired teacher-student ratio and to address the classroom shortage in our schools in the District, especially in Barangay Bagbag, the immediate passage of this bill is earnestly sought.

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*Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in
Congress Assembled:*

Section 1. There is hereby established, under the supervision of the Department of Education, an integrated school in Barangay Bagbag, Quezon City, Metro Manila to be known as Bagbag Integrated School.

Section 2. Appropriations. The Secretary of Education shall immediately include in the Department's program the operationalization of the Bagbag Integrated School, the funding of which shall be included in the annual General Appropriations Act.

Section 3. Implementation. The Secretary of Education shall issue rules and regulations necessary to carry out the purpose of this Act.

Section 4. Effectivity. -This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in at least two (2) newspapers of general circulation.
