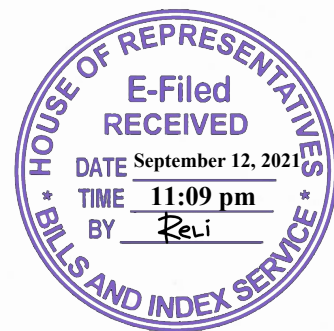

SEPARATING THE RODOLFO V. PAMOR JR. MEMORIAL NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL – SAGÑAY SOUTHEASTERN HIGH SCHOOL ANNEX IN BARANGAY TURAGUE, MUNICIPALITY OF SAGÑAY, PROVINCE OF CAMARINES SUR FROM THE RODOLFO V. PAMOR JR. MEMORIAL NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, CONVERTING IT INTO AN INDEPENDENT NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL TO BE KNOWN AS TURAGUE NATIONAL HIGH SCHOOL, AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS THEREFOR

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the Philippines in Congress assembled:

1 SECTION 1. The Rodolfo V. Pamor Jr. Memorial National High School – Sagñay
2 Southeastern High School Annex in Barangay Turague, Municipality of Sagñay, Province of
3 Camarines Sur is hereby separated from the Rodolfo V. Pamor Jr. Memorial National High
4 School and converted into an independent national high school to be known as Turague
5 National High School.

7 SEC. 2. All personnel, assets, liabilities and records of the Rodolfo V. Pamor Jr.
8 Memorial National High School – Sagñay Southeastern High School Annex are hereby
9 transferred to and absorbed by the Turague National High School.

11 SEC. 3. The Secretary of Education shall immediately include in the Department’s
12 program the operationalization of the Turague National High School, the initial funding of
13 which shall be charged against the current year’s appropriation of the Rodolfo V. Pamor Jr.
14 Memorial National High School – Sagñay Southeastern High School Annex. Thereafter, the
15 amount necessary for the continued operation of the school shall be included in the annual
16 General Appropriations Act.

18 SEC. 4. Within sixty (60) days after the approval of this Act, the Secretary of
19 Education shall promulgate the rules and regulations implementing the provisions of this Act.
20

21 SEC. 5. This Act shall take effect fifteen (15) days after its publication in the *Official*
22 *Gazette* or in a newspaper of general circulation.
